




EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT NEEDS NEIGHBOURHOOD SUPPORT

In recent months I've been banging on about the potential for disasters, our new Community Plan, and the need and desirability for setting up Neighbourhood Support Groups for each road in our area.

Well the Hooper Road Neighbourhood Support Group is having its Startup Meeting on 5 December, when the guy who runs the system comes to a meeting of residents, accompanied by a policeman to explain how it all works. We are also having Kelly Newell, the WDC Coordinator along, to explain how she would like to go about getting a Community Response Plan sorted, not only for our little Eureka area, but for the whole Eureka Ward.

Partly as a result of my liking to get things coordinated, the Emergency Management Group at the Regional Council, and our WDC Coordinator, Kelly Newell, are now starting to agree that having Neighbourhood Support groups around the place is a pretty good way to start putting together a Community Response Plan for Civil Defence Emergency Management.

At least they can then start with an idea of who lives where, who has email, and the likely number of people who might be looking for help, shelter or instructions, when everything round them is falling apart in one way or another. Despite the Eureka Express's continuing efforts to maintain a sense of community, I'm sure there are more and more people, even in Eureka, who don't know their neighbours very well, if at all, so wouldn't know how they could work together in trying times!

So I'm still looking for half a dozen community minded souls to offer to get their road set up, and a group officially started. So far I've had one response!

I've done a lot of research on foot and mouth disease since I wrote last, and it's pretty scary stuff. Having spoken to several people who went through the 2001 UK outbreak, it doesn't just stuff up your mind for a while, but lives with you forever. And it's not just FMD but any sort of biosecurity breach which is easier to contain, when people on the ground know what to do. DairyNZ aregetting onto it for advice to farmers, and would be happy to share their knowledge with Community Response Groups to get the message out as widely as possible.

So, have a great Christmas and New Year, and when you've wound down a bit, consider being collegial with your road mates, and help set up some more Neighbourhood Support Groups, at least round here. Remember, people in these groups get emailed a useful Bulletin every week, plus other stuff such as on CPR and making sure your vehicle is roadworthy for holiday travel etc. You even get photos of the 'baddies' still doing the rounds locally - a fairly unsavoury lot it would seem.

Oh by the way, the link on the WDC website to our new Community Plan is www.waidc.govt.nz/Documents/Plans/communityplans.aspx. I'm not sure when/if the new version will appear in printed form, but it's all there now, including interesting bits of history of not only Eureka, but Tauwhare, Matangi and Newstead too.





The afternoon was completed with the Sprint finals and some of the races were very close to the finish









IN YOUR GARDEN

With Christmas just around the corner, the festive season will be taking priority over the vegetable patch this month. But a little attention is important to ensure your vegetables continue to be productive throughout the summer. Regular watering, feeding, weeding and vigilance for pests and diseases are still high on the agenda. Be sure to mulch your most precious plants and if you're planning an extended holiday, arrange someone to water your garden to conserve all your hard work.



Sweet corn and beans will romp away in warm soil. Sow a fresh batch of mesclan salad mix before temperatures become too hot. Seedlings of most summer veges can still be planted, and will respond well to warm soil temperatures and generally more settled weather. Plant out seedlings of Zucchini, Melons, Pumpkins, Tomatoes, Eggplants, Peppers and Cucumbers.



Sow or plant peanuts. Peanuts are a fun novelty crop for warm, sunny, frost free gardens and I planted some last year just for kicks. These subtropical ground nuts form a small clump, about 30cm high, with little yellow flowers. What makes them peculiar is that once the flowers are pollinated, they extend like umbilical cords, all the way to the ground, then they bury their noses in the soil. The nuts develop underground; to harvest them, you haul the whole plant out at the end of summer. Peanuts like it hot but they can still be grown in marginal climates, though it's best to grow them in a large pot so you can take them into the glasshouse or

tunnelhouse to continue to pod up when summer runs out, as the pods take up to 140 days to mature.

Maintenance: Continue to tie tomato plants to stakes as they grow and remove laterals to promote better fruit production. Keep a close eye on insect pests and diseases and spray accordingly. Check watering systems are working effectively as you will need them next month.

Easy Fruit Cake


1 kg mixed fruit & 2 cups strong coffee - soak overnight

Bananas A Super Food

They are great on toast, in a lunch box, fruit salads or cooked – we love them grilled with brown sugar and cinnamon sprinkled on them with bacon and eggs (a real treat!).

On the home front.....



November / December brings us to the last Eureka
express for 2013, as I talked last month on lightening, brightening and opening
up areas to let the sun in, bring in the outdoors which in turn extends our living
spaces, But let's not forget the New Zealand sun and the damage it can do to
furniture, fabrics and flooring etc.

It's a great time of year and it is a shame to be limited by what damage the sun can do so following are a few ideas on ways in which might protect or help avoid the damage the CIV rays can do.

When choosing window treatments a man-made product such as polyester and viscose's has harder wearing properties then natural fibres such as cotton or linen, so be sure to check the composition of the fabric. Another opinion could be having sunshades installed to filter the sun and light to a room. These can be made a feature with a colour that completes a room or they can be a passive part of your window treatments.

Choosing wisely in colour for carpet, making sure you know your carpet, what its dying process is, some are more fade resistant than others. A tiled floor is a great way to avoid sun damage in large windowed homes with lots of sun, if you like this look and feel throughout the year. Tile entrance ways and edges where sun hits the hardest it can be an easy fix for some homes too.

When choosing paint, take into account the depth of colour and how much heat it will attract. The surface you are painting is important to, there are ways around painting darker colours and having paint with properties that minimize damage and last longer.

Enjoy the sun while it lasts and Happy Xmas holidays.

CO Comment for Eureka Express

It is timely as we lead up to the end of the year to think about the farms summer management plan. Hopefully yours is already in place but here's a few points to check off anyway.

- Pastures are in good growing condition and not too straggly. This will be a measure of your spring grazing residual management or perhaps a bit of topping. 2 or 3 lax grazings and the growing point of the tiller rises well above ground level and when next eaten the tiller dies and the pasture thins out.
- Nitrogen application is also an important tactic
 in late November early December as not only does it grow extra grass (moisture permitting)
 but also stimulates 35% more tillering than if no N was applied. You can apply rates
 between 30 and 50 kg N/Ha at this application. I.E. A little heavier than normal.
- Get rid of any obvious culls. Perhaps 3 titters or mastitis problem cows. You will KNOW the cows I am referring to.
- 4. Book in pregnancy testing. Consult your Vet as to how early you can effectively do it but if the feed situation gets tight being able to off-load empties that won't be in the herd next year makes good sense. Done earlier, usually receives a higher cull cow price and a better chance to get them off when you want to rather than at the discretion of the Works in the middle of a "log jam".
- Plan your supplement feeding (crops and bought in feed) and see how many days at say 5kg DM/cow/day that you can feed if need be. Make sure you allow for 100 – 150 kg DM/cow for the 3 week period straight after it rains and of course any feed you want to keep for winter or early spring.
- There is a new player just entering the PKE market selling direct to farmers so there may be a little more competition in the heat of summer for your business. Apparently they are a big player in PKE market World-wide.
- Think about a OAD milking strategy. If SCC allows this can release a bit of stress on both
 the cows and people. Cows on OAD don't eat any less but do not lose weight as fast. Don't
 start too late. You can start when they reach around 60 70% of their peak production.
 Keep feeding them as you would on TAD.
- Take a break. Yes a very important part of the summer plan. Block out some serious family time both at home but also away from the farm.
- Toward the end of summer think about your drying off rules to achieve the necessary body condition score targets. In reality this is no more than 20% of the herd below BCS 5 at June 1st.
- The last part of the plan is a relatively new one and that is try and avoid over grazing of pastures during the summer. This greatly improves pasture persistence.

Hopefully the summer is kind to you, but in the event that it is not the above planning will help you get through with less stress and less impact on your bottom line. Have a great Christmas!


