

So that's that with kind wishes.



#### EUREKA HALL AGM

Held Tuesday 12 August 2014 at 7.45pm at the Hall.

Present: Nine people attended. Current Chairman Philip Mayall chaired the meeting.

Apologies: Margaret and Maurice Smith.

Absent: Peter Scatchard.

MINUTES of the previous Annual General Meeting were read and received.

Mvd L Orr/B Mayall. Carried

- Community records have been filed in the Chubb fireproof cabinets.
   No community functions were organised by the Hall Committee this year. For discussion later in meeting.
- 3. The Eureka Express Committee has agreed to gift the Hall Committee \$5000 towards new chairs. The money is invested in the meantime.
- 4. The Hall exterior was painted in December by Chris Jones of Roof Coaters Ltd at the cost of \$7095.50. Also in December the bricked gardens in front of the hall were repaired and replanted thanks to two locals, Christine Whiteley and Maurice Smith.

CORRESPONDENCE: The WDC final draft copy of the Terms of Reference for Management of Community Halls, plus a Hall Hazard Identification Checklist was perused and replied to by 2 September 2013. No further correspondence on the matter has been received.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Treasurer, Lionel Orr presented his Financial Report. The 2013 - 2014 Financial Statement has been audited by John Morch. Balance at 30 June \$8609.73 That Financial Report be accepted, John Morch be asked to continue as our auditor, and the 3 bank cheque signatories, being G Mayall, L Orr and P Mayall, remain the same.

Mvd: L. Orr/B Mayall. Carried. The possibility of raising the Hall levy in the WDC Rates was discussed. Due to our present low balance and income it was decided to ask WDC to raise our levy from the present \$25 to \$35.

- 1. The hall was painted in December and comments have been favourable. However the promised free roof painting by Chris Jones has not eventuated .. yet!
- 2. The window broken at the time of painting with no-one admitting liability was fixed at the cost of \$1000.

#### GENERAL BUSINESS:

- Bus Shelter. Consent has been given by WDC for the Eureka Community Committee, with compliments of Walkato Sheds to erect a bus shelter with the boundary of Eureka Hall on SH 26. The Hall Committee is in agreement and our Chairman will talk to Brian Insoll re concept and timeframe.
- 2. That Maurice Smith be thanked for his regular owing of the Hall grounds
- The matter of new chairs was discussed. Minimum number of 1100 would, at cheapest, cost \$5000.00. It was decided that new chairs are not a priority with our current balance sheet and some roof maintenance pending.

 Roof Maintenance of the Hall roof is a definite priority. Chairman to ask local builder, Craig Griffin, to assess the situation and report back.

The need for, and the type of, community function was discussed. Ideas put forward were: a movie night, a Pot-luck dinner, a mid-winter Xmas dinner, or a summer BBQ

That the AGM Minutes, committee member list, hireage rates, plus the audited accounts be sent to the WDC by the end of September.



#### IN YOUR GARDEN

Spring is almost here and what a joy it is to see all those trees, bulbs and shrubs slowly coming to life, the perfume of daphne is devine and the promise of blooms to come is great.

Did you know that all daffodils should be picked so that the bulbs grow larger and produce more blooms next year. Be wary of the white sap that oozes from the daffodil stem as this sticky substance can cause a rash. If animals eat daffodil sap it will induce vomiting and if large quantities are ingested it could be deadly. If you wish to include daffodils in a mixed bouquet, condition them first as their



sap is toxic to other flowers. Place the daffodils in a jar containing 3cm of water and add ½ tsp sugar, when daffodils have slurped up all the liquid you can then put them in a fresh vase of water with other mixed flowers.

Did you know? Citrus fruit is in an abundance right now, but only pick what you need as citrus fruit dosn't continue to ripen once picked, but will keep several months if left on the tree, although the longer it stays on the tree the less acidic it will become.

Potatoes; if you want fresh spuds for Christmas dinner you must plant right now and protect from frosts, another 2 weeks and you're too late. Prepare ground with well rotted manure, compost or blood & bone. Plant Jersey Bennie, Rocket, Swift or old time favourite Cliffs Kidney. Plant in trenches 20cm deep, mound up and spray at weekly intervals with copper.

August is the perfect time to plant a new rose. Ensure it has sun for at least half the day and shelter from strong winds. Dig a hole bigger than you think you will need and a mound of good quality damp potting soil at the bottom. Sit the rose on it with it's roots spread out. Fill the hole gradually so that the bud union (where the branches meet) is just covered and tamp down gently, slowly water it well. Add more soil if necessary and gently fork in a handful of blood and bone. Keep it moist over the next few months. Never put fertiliser at the bottom of the hole as you risk burning new roots.

If you planted your garlic on the shortest day in June, you can now plant a second batch which will result in smaller bulbs but with more intense flavour.

Warm up your soil with a thick layer of mulch. Mulching protects and insulates your soil to ensure plant roots stay warm in winter and cool in summer. Organic mulches such as straw and sawdust also condition the soil as they slowly decompose and provide an ideal environment for earthworms and other beneficial organisms.

Warm sun will encourage Hostas, Delphiniums and Lilly bulbs to sprout, but add snail bait or they will disappear again.



Prepare ground for planting vegetables. Use a hoe to cut away any weeds off below soil level without bringing more seeds to the surface. Once weeds stop popping up plant seedlings or direct sow seeds.

There is much for the keen gardener to do, so good luck and get to it.

#### Muesli Slice

Melt together in pot:

1/2lb butter

1 T golden syrup

3/4 cup sugar

1 1/2 cup sultanas (you can add chopped apricots, pumpkin seeds, and sesame seeds)

Remove from heat and add:

2 cups rolled oats

1 cup flour

1 t baking soda

Bake in a slice tin 180c for 20 minutes. Slice when cold



#### Passionfruit and Pistachio Slice

#### Base:

2 x 250g packets wine biscuits crushed 2/3 pistachio nuts, coarsely chopped 1 x 395g tin sweetened condensed milk 200g melted butter zest of 1 lemon

#### Icing:

2 cups icing sugar 50g butter softened 2 T passionfruit pulp milk

Grease and line a 20x30cm slice tin. Set aside.



Combine all base ingredients in a bowl and mix thoroughly. Place mixture in slice tin and press down firmly. Place slice in fridge while making icing.

Sift icing sugar then add butter, passionfruit pulp and enough milk to make a spreadable consistency. Spread over cooled base, then place in the fridge until set. Cut into squares.



#### CO comment for Eureka Express

The obvious topic for this month is the calving season, with everyone well geared, and some nearing the other side. The quota of heifer replacements is being filled, and there is a general feel of content with progress to date. On this note, the final step in the phasing out of routine inductions will come into effect next calving season (1st June 2015), with no routine inductions on NZ dairy farms. There will be a session on how to best prepare for this at the Reproduction Field Day in September (further details below).



The other key topic is the current start to the season in terms of the payout. The forecasted milk price now at \$6/kgMS, alongside rising interest rates, reflect the importance in making well informed decisions in regards to farm working expenses and capital expenditure. Where supplementary feed is most economical, to meet feed requirements at crucial times of the year, for example mating, DairyNZ works on the 5 percent rule for supplementary feed. So at a \$6 payout, 5 percent of this equates to paying up to 30c/kgDM for bought in feed. Also, milk production prior to Christmas is becoming increasingly important in reducing the pressure over the summer dry period.



This leads onto a big congratulation to Brett and Rachael Gordon, on Waverley Road, who won Walkato/Bay of Plenty Best Equal Farm Business at the 2014 Dairy Business Of the Year awards. The Gordon's hosted a discussion group a few months back, and their farm reports showcased a consistently very profitable, low cost operation, with a high awareness of costs and control of those on farm. This is very valuable and huge credit to them both if the current volatile market

remains in place. There will be a Field Day at the Gordon's, on the 18th November which is the ideal opportunity to learn and see first-hand what happens on this high performing farm. For further details and to register, go online to www.dboycomp.com


