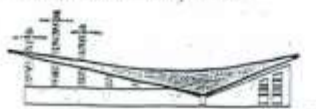

8 People attended. Current chairperson, Philip Mayall chaired the meeting.

Minutes of the previous AGM were read and received.

Matters Arising:

1. Painter, Wayne Brown's quote to treat and paint the Hall roof at the cost of \$3,169.40 has been accepted and the job is on his 'to do list'.
2. The WDC has agreed to our request to raise the Hall annual rating levy from \$26 to \$35.

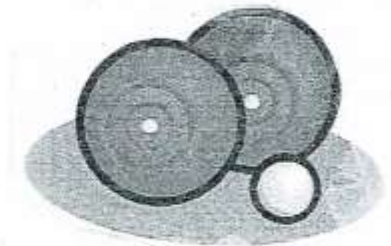

LADIES A PLATE

Cheesy Cauliflower Patties

1 head cauliflower
2 large eggs
1/2 c cheddar cheese, grated
1/2 c panko (found in the bread crumb aisle, healthier option)
1/2 t cayenne pepper (more or less to taste)
salt & olive oil



Cut cauliflower into florets & cook in boiling water until tender about 10 minutes. Drain. Mash the cauliflower while still warm. Stir cheese, eggs, panko, cayenne & salt to taste.

Coat the bottom of a griddle or skillet with olive oil over medium-high heat. Form the cauliflower mixture into patties about 3 inches across. Cook until golden brown & set, about 3 minutes per side. Keep each batch warm in the oven while you cook the rest

Lemon Meringue CupCakes!!!

Lemon Filling:

3 egg yolks (reserve whites for meringue)	3/4 cup granulated white sugar
3 tbsp. all-purpose flour	pinch of salt
3 tbsp. lemon juice	2 tbsp. lemon zest, loosely packed
1/2 cup water	2 tbsp. unsalted butter, melted

Cupcakes:

1/2 cup unsalted butter	1 cup sugar
2 eggs	3 tbsp. lemon juice
2 tsp. baking powder	1 tsp. salt
1-1/2 cups all-purpose flour	

Cupcakes:

3 egg whites	pinch of salt	1/4 cup sugar
--------------	---------------	---------------

1) Make lemon filling: In small saucepan over low heat, whisk egg yolks, sugar, flour, and salt; whisk in lemon juice, lemon zest, water, and melted butter; increase heat to medium and, whisking constantly, cook until lemon filling is smooth and thick, about 7 minutes; remove from heat and set aside

2) Preheat oven to 375 degrees

3) Make cupcakes: In medium bowl, beat butter and sugar until light and fluffy; beat in eggs, lemon juice, baking powder, and salt; beat in flour until just combined

4) Divide cupcake batter between 12 cupcake liners in a muffin pan; bake 15-16 minutes until center of cupcakes firms up; remove cupcakes from oven and cool 5-8 minutes (do not turn off oven)

5) Meanwhile, make meringue: beat egg whites with salt until mixture begins to stiffen; add sugar and beat until meringue is stiff and forms pretty peaks (don't overdo it)

6) With a sharp knife, remove center of each cupcake (about 1" in diameter), leaving a layer of cupcake beneath cut out; discard cupcake core (or treat the weary baker to a tart little snack); fill cupcake centers with lemon filling

7) Divide dollops of meringue between cupcakes, spreading out to edges and gently tapping with back of spoon to form peaks; return cupcakes to oven and bake an additional 5-6 minutes until meringue peaks are golden brown; remove from oven and let cool 10 minutes; refrigerate an hour or more before serving

Makes: 12 absolutely delicious cupcakes.

IN YOUR GARDEN

Well as usual this time of year Christmas is just around the corner...where does the time go.

It's planting time, we have milder weather and grass is trying to grow... Spring is here!

All salad crops could be planted now as long as you don't live in a low lying frost area. If you are in a frost prone area you could plant tomatoes in a plastic or glass house, as we could get a light frost at the end of September. Avoid planting very frost tender plants maybe till Labour Weekend.

When planting veges or making a vege box, don't fill the area with compost at the bottom, fill with stones, old soil etc, then 30cm from the top put in compost, as veges only need to grow about 20cm into the ground, compost below this level will not be reached by the plant roots.

Most of don't have much time for gardening etc. If you can put a couple of hours into forming a vege garden, plant, and in a few weeks when you're harvesting and enjoying your fresh spray-free veg you'll be happy you put the time in.

Bark is a good weed suppressant around large trees and shrubs but if used on a garden with flowering plants, small shrubs and the like, bark will leach the nitrogen from the soil.

Daffodils are looking great in most gardens at the moment, remember when flowering has finished don't cut back but leave the stems to die off and this encourage new bulbs to form.

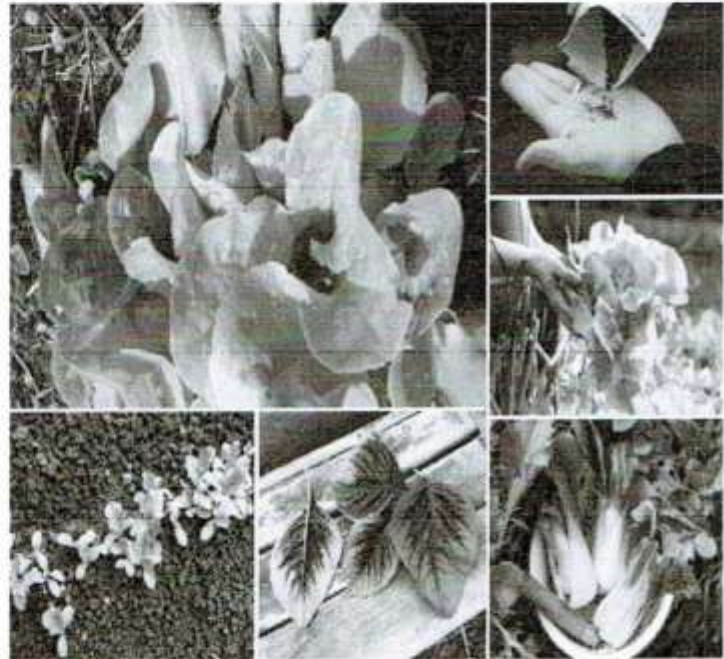
All roses and fruit trees should be pruned as we discussed last month, if not do it as soon as possible.

6 Tips For Success: Preparing for Yearling Mating

Your yearlings are the future of your herd and are often your highest genetic merit animals. Mating them at the right time with the right bull is important to ensure they calve early and easily.

Ensure heifers meet live weight targets – Studies show that heifers which meet live weight targets at mating get in calf faster, produce more, and are more likely to get in-calf early in the following season.

Mate heifers 7-10 days ahead of the herd – Mating heifers ahead of the herd ensures that the extra time they take to resume cycling is less likely to affect their future reproductive performance once in the milking herd.

If doing AB, select easy-calving bulls – A sire's calving difficulty breeding value (BV) predicts the percentage of assisted calvings expected when he is mated to yearlings. The lower the BV the less assistance that's expected. For more information talk to your breeding company.

If doing AB, contact the relevant people – It's important to communicate early with vets, AB techs and AB companies to ensure everything is organised especially for synchronies; don't let poor planning compromise your results.

Select well grown, healthy bulls for natural mating – Make sure bulls are well grown, sound, vaccinated for Lepto and are TB and BVD free. Observe the bulls working and promptly replace any that are not performing.

Make sure you have enough bull power – 1 bull per 30 heifers is the recommendation (with a minimum of two bulls at any given time – see page 128 of the InCalf book for more information). Special attention needs to be taken if you intend to synchronise heifers for AB as the demand on bull power increases significantly over a short period of time when they return to heat. Consider removing the bulls and reintroducing AB 18-24 days after the synchrony mating date.

For one-on-one advice and support specific to your farm, phone the clinic to make an appointment with one of the team.

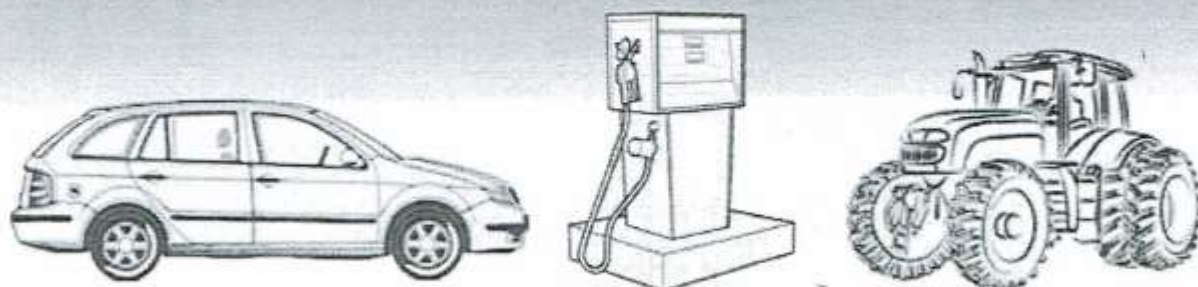
