We are thoroughly enjoying our property and love the magnificent views, we have great tenants in the other house and have embraced country living wholeheartedly.







LADIES A PLATE

Cauliflower Salad!!!

I love potato salad...but I hate all those carbs...so I made a low carb potato salad / with cauliflower instead.... it was SOOOO good!!!

1 head of cauliflower steamed or boiled until tender in bite size pieces 6 boiled eggs (when done peel eggs, rinse and separate yokes into a bowl. Then mash the yolk and cut the whites into small bite size pieces then blend together.

1/3 cup (approx.) miracle whip or mayonnaise (don't use light it has more carbs)

3 tbs of mustard

3 tbs of pickle relish

1/8 cup of chopped onion (uncooked) can use more if you prefer salt/pepper to taste

mix all together and you can garnish with egg slices and parsley. Chill overnight (1 cup of cauliflower is only 3 carbs vs 1 cup of potato is 37!!)



Cauliflower 'Bread' Sticks

If you are trying to get away from Bread... Cauliflower!

It might be easily passed but this Nutrient Dense cabbage is Low in Fat & Carbs, high in Fibre and Rich in Anti-oxidants... and makes a pretty darn good replacement of bread but it's low carb, gluten free and grain free!

Cauliflower 'bread' Sticks:

1 head of Cauliflower

1/2 cup shredded Cheese

2 Eggs, beaten

1 tsp dried Parsley or Oregano or Basil

2 cloves Garlic, minced

Onion powder, Salt & Pepper to taste

- 1. Preheat the oven to 450 degrees.
- 2. Cut up Cauliflower and steam till soft.. put on a tea towel and blot, try to get as 'dry' as possible.
- 3. Put in food processor or blend till it's mashed potato texture.
- 4. In medium bowl stir Cauliflower, Eggs, Cheese, Garlic & Seasonings
- 5. Lightly spray baking pan and pat the mixture out.
- 6. Bake at 450 for 15-20 minutes or until top starts to brown

IN YOUR GARDEN

Because of the dry conditions of the past 2 months there hasn't been much activity in the garden and unless you have an unlimited water supply it's best to just cut back, clean up and mulch. Look after your fruit trees with a general spray of copper.

I acquired this article on worm farms which I thought would be of interest to all.

It seems to be a widely held belief that if you cut a worm in half you will have two worms. Wrong, you will have one dead worm! Though they can survive losing a few segments off their tails. They will eat anything that has been alive, though some experts say they do not like onion skins or citrus, as the latter is too acid for them. Other experts say it doesn't matter. As worms breathe through pores in their



skins, greasy or fatty foods should not be put in the heap, as fatty foods may clog the worm's breathing pores and cause them to suffocate. Worms are said to eat their own weight in food a day. Since they require oxygen, they need a damp, but not waterlogged environment. Although compost worms tend to feed near the top of the heap, they also tend to burrow away from the light, so the heap or bin needs to be covered with an old damp sack or piece of carpet. Worms are hermaphrodite, that is they are capable of performing both the male and female function — but it takes two to tango! The worms mate by twining together, and an exchange of semen takes place. Each worm can then lay an egg. The eggs are like tiny round pieces of amber jelly. Each egg may have up to 4 baby worms inside. During adverse conditions, as in a drought for example, the egg sacs can survive unhatched until conditions are suitable for the survival of the newly hatched baby worms. On hatching, the tiny threadlike worms are self-sufficient, and promptly set about the business of feeding and growing. The content of their guts can be seen through their transparent skins. How fast they grow depends on things like availability of food, and temperature. Worm populations are said to be self-regulating, according to their environment. It is recommended that worms are not handled with bare hands, as human skin exudates can affect their sexual prowess.



If you are interested in trying worm composting on a small scale, a good way to start is with an old wooden apple box. Make sure that there a few holes in the bottom and line with 5 or 6 pages of damp newspaper, add 10-15 cm of litter consisting of a mix of damp peat moss with a little dolomite lime added (to take off the acidity), and damp shredded paper. A sprinkle of garden soil, if you like. Put the worms on top, add chopped up

vegetable peel, leaves etc. Some dung if you can get it, then cover the lot with a damp sack or old piece of carpet. Add vegetable waste from time to time and keep damp. The other alternative is to let the worms loose on an existing compost heap, and let them get on with it! Don't smother them with too many lawn clippings though as they may overheat. Happy gardening!!!

On the home front.....

I also enjoyed time white washing outdoor furniture, having the ability to dress it with bright patterned cushions and vintage table pieces this has made for a simple yet subtle difference, which keeps encouraging me to make the most of the outdoors at home. It's also given the wood new life and will help to maintain the furniture against the suns effects.

Often a neutral pastel palette is used, either in the grey tones or warmer beiges, then accents of bright colours are often added, this helps to keep it simple yet effective and allows a stand out effect.

NEWS FROM YOUR WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Happy New Year to all. I hope you have taken the opportunity during the long hot summer to visit some of the beautiful reserves and beaches in the Waikato District and use the river cycleways. The Te Awa River Ride is becoming very popular with work now being done to link Ngaruawahia to Horotiu including a bridge over the Waikato River. The beach patrols at Ngarunui Beach at Raglan and Sunset Beach at Port Waikato will continue until Easter with hours of operation varying. You can also walk your dog on a leash in almost all District public parks and reserves. There are also off-leash areas throughout the district including some beaches. To view a full list of dog exercise areas visit www.waikatodistrict.govt.nz/services/animals/aspx The Hakarimata Summit Track in Ngaruawahia is also a very popular destination with a 100,000 visitors using the track last year.

The prolonged dry weather has resulted in Council suspending the issuing of fire permits until further notice. This is will be reviewed once we have had significant rain fall. If you have a current permit it is no longer valid. Council will contact residents who have already submitted a permit during the restricted fire season.

February is a busy month at Council. As well as our usual round of committee meetings we will be hearing submissions to the Proposed Gambling Venues Policy and Local Alcohol Policy and reviewing the Stock Movement bylaw, last reviewed in 2011, and making changes as necessary.

We also held a series of Long Term Plan 2015-25 (LTP) workshops and at the moment the final document is being put together. A summary of the Draft LTP will be mailed out to residents soon with submissions closing in April - the Government Auditors have to tick it off before it can be circulated. Please use the opportunity to participate and give us your feedback.

I mentioned in my last newsletter that Council is investigating various options for better managing **rubbish** (solid waste) and recycling collection and we sent out a survey to all ratepayers before Christmas to gauge opinion on proposed changes. About 3000 residents responded and 63% voted to retain the status quo. (The status quo allows for one recycling bin, which I believe is sufficient, and two bags of rubbish per week at a cost, through your rates, of \$196.00 per household.)

Councillors considered the survey feedback and discussed the draft policy last week and voted by a small majority to put out the draft policy, as circulated, for further consultation - i.e. \$127.81 for two recycling bins paid through your rates and an additional \$1.50 per bag of rubbish. E.g. If you send two bags per week you will pay an additional \$156.00 per year.

The rationale for charging per bag of rubbish is of course to reduce the amount of rubbish going to land fill but I am struggling to see how we can do much better. I think most householders already endeavour to reduce their landfill rubbish and the only improvement I can envisage is perhaps a food waste collection which could help depending how you deal with your food waste. I would be interested in your comments and encourage you to make a submission on the draft policy through the Draft Long Term Plan process.

If the proposed policy goes through as a pre paid rubbish bag collection and you have rental properties and or farm worker accommodation you will have to work out how you will deal with the bag cost for these properties because at the moment you pay for tenant's rubbish removal through your rates and your tenants put out their rubbish at no extra cost.

Council will soon be undertaking a tender process for **district wide road maintenance services**. We will move to an alliance approach and partner with a qualified organization as roading contracts expire. New contractors will be able to tender directly or as subcontractors. I will give further information as this new concept evolves.

District wide universal water metering will soon be implemented with a consistent charging regime being proposed. The cost of all water delivery will be averaged out over the district. This will result in increased costs for some areas; decreased costs for other areas. In the Draft Annual Plan the targeted rate for those in the Southern Districts will reduce from the current charge of \$339.00 per year to \$200.00. The charge includes a line charge. You will still be charged for water usage, the rate likely to be around \$1.70/cu m. The \$200 for Southern Districts will allow for a yearly surplus, to be used for improvements and maintenance. We are also proposing to build two water reservoirs in the Southern Districts probably around Matangi / Tamahere.


