

If you're not into hens you may want to skip this paragraph because when it comes to my animals I can ramble on and on. I have two Faverolle hens (Henny and Penny) I love their look with their unique five feathered toes, they are meant to give me around 100 eggs per year but so far they are still thinking about it. My next two girls are little bantams, they are Sebrights (Clucky and Lucky) these two are cutie pies. They look like an artist has come along and painted them, they come in gold or silver, I have two gold ones. Even though these girls are small in size they have a lot of spunk in their personality and are the only girls paying their way so far, by laying me little eggs every day. A few months ago I purchased four little chicks for one of my clucky hens (Henny) two of these chicks are Rhode Island Red (Custard and Cream) they are gorgeous looking girls and have a lovely calm nature. This breed is meant to be a great layer with around 200-300 eggs per year, so I'm looking forward to when they start laying. The other two chicks are Barnevelders, one ended up being a rooster (Cocoa) a very handsome looking lad with a mix of colour, being black, green and blue and the other Barnevelder chick is Coffee, and she is meant to produce about 170 eggs per year. Now if you're wondering where these interesting names came from, I have my niece (Mia) to thank she has a very creative mind and loves animals. Mia and her Mum live on Hooper Road, so whenever I get an animal Mia doesn't take long to come up with a name.

We have had such a busy term and the children and the school community have been involved in so many different activities.





LADIES A PLATE

Mini Apple Crumbles Ingredients:

2 large Bramley cooking apples, peeled, cored and chopped
3 tbsp maple syrup juice of ½ lemon
½ tsp ground allspice
55g unsalted butter
100g porridge oats
40g light muscovado sugar
Double cream, to serve



Method:

- Preheat the oven to 220°C/425°F. Place a baking sheet in the oven to preheat.
 Place the apples, maple syrup, lemon juice and allspice in a large saucepan over a
 medium heat. Bring to the boil, stirring occasionally, then cover and cook for 5
 minutes, until tender.
- Meanwhile, melt the butter in a small saucepan over a medium heat. Remove from the heat and stir in the oats and sugar.
- Divide the apples between four 200ml ovenproof dishes and sprinkle over the oat mixture. Bake on the baking sheet in the preheated oven for 10 minutes, until lightly browned and bubbling.
- Serve immediately with double cream.

Quick Chicken Pie

Ingredients

2 tbsp olive oil 175g baby button mushrooms 115g crème fraiche 375g ready-rolled short crust pastry Salt and pepper 450g chicken breast strips

1 bunch spring onions, chopped

4 tbsp chicken stock

Beaten egg or milk, to glaze Green vegetables, to serve

Method:

- Preheat oven to 220°C/425°F. Place a baking sheet in the oven to preheat.
- Heat the oil in a large frying pan over a high heat. Add the chicken and cook for 2-3 minutes, stirring frequently. Add the mushrooms and onions and cook for a further 2 minutes.
- Add the crème fraiche, stock and salt and pepper to taste, then top into a 1.4litre shallow, ovenproof metal dish.
- Lift the pastry on top, scrunching the edges in with your fingers to fit inside the rim
 of the dish. Make a small slit in the centre and brush with beaten egg to glaze.
- Place the dish on the preheated baking sheet and bake for 20-25 minutes, until the pastry is golden and firm. Transfer to warmed serving plates and serve immediately with green vegetables.
