The prospect of Emma driving is the next thing to stress me out; seated on the passenger's side with gritted teeth and white knuckles my nerves will be shot.

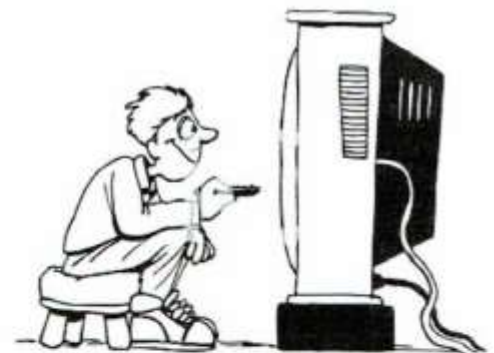

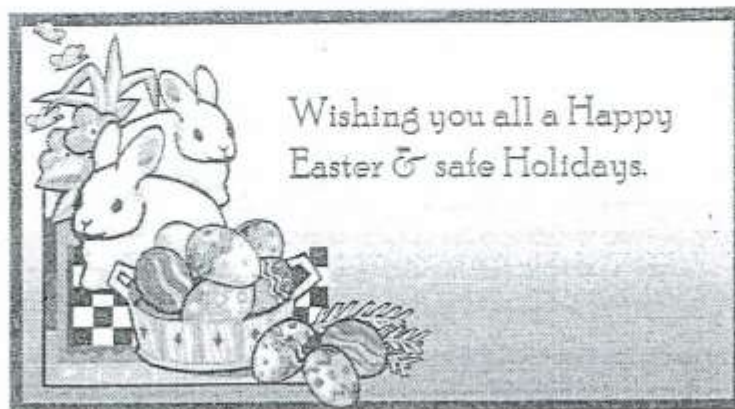

We had a few visits from Leprechauns in the lead up to St Patrick's Day. The children made some very elaborate traps to try and catch them but they always seemed to get away.

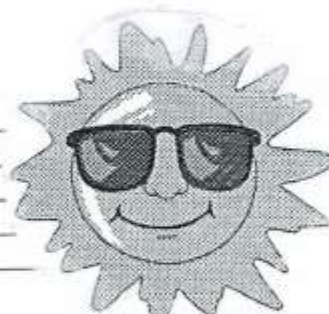

The major event for April will be the match against Gordonton for the Brown Bowl. Tauwhare are the present holders.

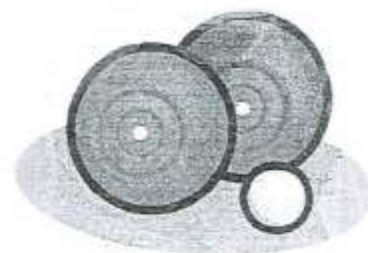

THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT BURGLARY

WHO burgles a house?

- A burglar can be male or female of any age, height, size, colour or race;
- They may operate alone, in pairs or in groups;
- They may be on foot or could use a vehicle, motor bike or bicycle to check out your neighbourhood;

WHEN do burglars strike?

- They burgle houses by day and night, come rain or shine – especially when they can see no one's home or the risk of being seen, or caught is low;
- They often burgle one or more nearby houses in the neighbourhood.
- They often return to a burgled house a few weeks or months later when the stolen items have been replaced.

WHERE do burglars pick their victims?

- The house looks empty, like there's no one home – lights aren't on at night, curtains may be closed during the day, or mail and newspapers have been left to accumulate in the letterbox. The phone keeps ringing instead of going straight to answerphone: no one home!
- Names on rural letterboxes which enable burglars to ring the telephone number and check if anyone is at home!
- Some windows or doors open or unsecured, for the cat and dog, or just like people used to in the "good old days";
- The house is not easily visible from the street, there are lots of trees and shrubs to hide the burglars from those nosey neighbours;
- The house is conveniently situated next to an alleyway, park or reserve so they can get into and out of the house as quickly and quietly as possible;
- Items of value are left outside to be stolen: bikes, copper plant pots for example;
- A television glowing in clear view from the street;
- Garage door left open too, so it can be seen that the car isn't there and the lawnmower and chainsaw are up for grabs!
- If they've been to the house before they will know the layout pretty well.

WHY DO BURGLARS STEAL?

- They want cash, and small valuable items like jewellery, electronic and portable digital equipment, alcohol, and tobacco which can be quickly converted into cash or drugs;
- Whatever is on their "shopping list" which is often kept in the "getaway car". Remember burglars earn their living doing this!

WHAT PUTS A BURGLAR OFF?

- Houses with alarms. Especially properly installed alarms which are always armed whenever the occupier goes out no matter how long for;
- Houses with security lighting, especially the kind that is set up properly and which works;
- Neighbourhood Support signs and stickers; suspicious, enquiring neighbours; people who challenge them; people who call the Police;
- Dogs. Or guard dog signs on fences and gates;
- Houses with good, solid, locked, locks and doors, windows and other entry points.
- A vehicle in the driveway;
- Lights, TV and radio are on;
- People who advertise that they are using SNAP and SelectaDNA.

On the home front.....

Have you ever thought of colour as a non-verbal form of communication, silently speaking volumes by setting mood, reflecting emotion and inspiring action. With this in mind, ask yourself how important is colour?

Colour can have a powerful effect to the look and feel of a space following are a few ideas on the impact of colour can have.



Bright Red:

Exciting, energizing, passionate, powerful or aggressive, and antagonistic.

Deep Blue:

Credible, authoritative, basic, classic, service, loyal, confident or aloof, distant, melancholy.

Sky Blue:

Calming, cool, heavenly, true, serene, and expansive.

Neutral Grey:

Classic, sober, corporate, practical, timeless.

Dark Green:

Nature, trustworthy, refreshing, cool, restful, traditional, reliable.

IN YOUR GARDEN

Hi Folks,

Well it's been a few months since I wrote. Weather patterns are changing from hot dry days without any rain to cooler nights, even down to 6 degrees! The days also are getting cooler. A few of us have had some rain, but not nearly enough.

It's time to prepare and plant winter veges now, clear out the vege patch and dig in some compost. If you need some we have mushroom compost, which is sterilised to stop mushrooms growing, but better still it is guaranteed weed free, and has no bark! It consists of chicken manure, straw and peat and has very little lime, so can be used around acidic plants such as Daphne, Camellias, Azaleas, Rhododendrons etc.



All brassica, some lettuce varieties and herbs can be planted now, along with other veges such as beetroot, celery, leeks etc.

Spray your fruit trees (that aren't fruiting) and roses with copper spray to clean up and harden new growth for winter.

The farming community are feeling the pinch with milk prices down and very little grass and are managing with silage, hay

and meal. Staying positive is sometimes difficult, but keep your heads high as with any business we manage to get through the lows and then enjoy the highs.

HEALTHY RIVERS PROJECT

I know that some of you think that things going on by the District or Regional Council are tedious, boring and often only worthy of criticism when decisions are finally made.

And in the past the Regional Council has appeared particularly aloof, with seemingly little real consultation over water and other matters.

However, with a new CEO, Vaughan Payne, and Paula Southgate as Chair **things have changed**. I regularly attend Waikato Federated Farmers Executive Meetings (by invitation) and even those hardy critics are finding information flows from WRC and meetings with Councillors are no longer a 'clash of titans' but fairly amiable discussions. When WRC was invited to the last Feds meeting to talk about the Long Term Plan they brought 10 Councillors with them, and they even stayed to lunch!

On the Healthy Rivers Wai Ora issues the 24 member Collaborative Stakeholder Group has not only been visiting a very representative list of 'involved parties' around the Waikato, but has been holding a series of 'stakeholder meetings' to update a very wide selection of interested parties (140 at the most recent one) and to seek a lot of input into what they are trying to do, and how they are going about it.

Now you all get a turn to have a say.

During April they are holding four 'drop-in' sessions around the region, where everyone in communities is invited to come and see what's been done so far, and be able to make comments and suggestions on how, what, and why what still has to be done gets done.

The most local one for Eurekaans will be held on **Monday, 13 April, 7-9.30 at the Hamilton Gardens Pavilion.**

At the most recent 'large' meeting the CSG revealed that their initial choice of Freshwater Management Units (as required by the Government's National Objectives on Freshwater) will be roughly the same as for the various WRC Catchment Committees. Some discussion groups expressed concern that the four focus areas for the CSG (Nitrogen, Phosphorus, E.coli and sediment) were not only different in the various FMUs, but also need to get a broader view, and include attributes like human system health, ecosystem health, and water clarity. With the Vision and Strategy for the Waikato/Waipara Rivers signed into law, Waikato has to try harder than some other areas - we also have to be able to swim in, and take food from our waters.

After each big meeting the CSG are presented with yards and yards of written ideas, from which to synthesize the ideas expressed most often and most forcibly. So they are listening!

As I'm now a landholder rep on the WRC Catchment Committee for the Central Zone (Karapiro to Ngaruawahia) I'm attending meetings in all directions, wearing one of what currently feels like my 50 hats. It would be comforting if I felt that others in the district were moved to attend some, and were also aware of what is being done and planned.

So please mark 13 April on your calendars and try to get to the Gardens that evening.

CO Comment

With autumn here with the crisp dewy mornings and sunny days, the long overdue rain finally arrived! A couple of good downpours earlier on gave green tinges to the grass that will now generate decent growth and pasture covers with follow up rain.

In general, farmers remained fairly positive over the summer dry even in light of the low payout, because most of them have been here before and now have systems in place to handle these situations better. Building resilient farming systems that can handle the seasonal variability is a perspective we now need to have.

A key focus for the start of the New Year for DairyNZ has been launching the Tactics for Tight Times Campaign, to provide farmers with resources to ensure their farming system is resilient to manage the volatile milk price and summer dry. There are 29 host farms around the country covering a range of systems and different ownership structures. We will be following these farms for the next 18 months with several fielddays to track their progress on the real decisions they make during this season and the next. These fieldday's also give insight to the dairy industry's economic situation and flow on effects to budgets and monthly cashflows, and provide an opportunity to discuss seasonal or regional issues for example the implications of milking vs drying off.

The Gordonton medium input (system 3) farm owned by Graeme & Karen Bonnar with impressive financial KPI's and a consistent low cost profitable operation had their 1st fieldday mid-March. This fieldday introduced the farm system, the hosts philosophies and decision making processes around tactical financial decision making and future decisions. It also proved to be a great opportunity for people who have been farming for some time with a lot of experience, to share their lessons learnt and offer valuable advice to other people who may be really struggling during these tighter times.

The 2nd fieldday is on the 27th May, and will update us on the progress of the Bonnar's plans, how the rest of the season went for them and the effects on their budget and long term plans as well as a seasonal topic yet to be decided.

So a key area of focus for the next month is doing a realistic monthly cashflow forecast for the winter considering only 5 cent retros will be coming in for June & July – Know what you've got! I encourage you to get engaged with your bank manager, accountant and trusted advisers to make a plan and monitor progress, especially if your business may come under substantial pressure. Remember a problem shared is a problem halved, and the sooner you deal with it the easier it is to manage and the more options you have available to you.

Apply this same principle to your herd with a dry-off plan to ensure your cows reach BCS targets at calving. Regular monitoring of both your herd average, and BCS range across the herd are important to identify and manage your at risk cows (lighter, earlier calving) so they have adequate time to reach BCS targets.

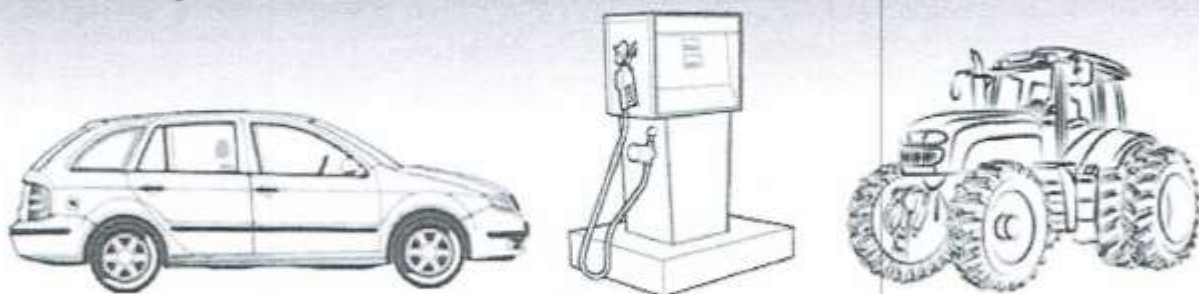
