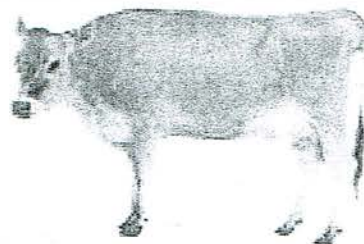

Pukeko Preschool – June 2016

Pukeko Preschool would like your input!

In response to the changing needs of our community, Pukeko Preschool is considering extending our opening hours. We intend to keep our existing main session of 8.45am – 2.45pm, and our short session of 8.45am – 1.00pm, as we know these session times suit many of the families in the area.

The Board is considering extending our opening hours to 7.45am until 4.30pm. We would like the opinions of the residents of Tauwhare, Eureka and the surrounding areas from Cambridge to Morrinsville to Hamilton. Please let us know if these extended hours would be attractive to you, and which combination of hours you would most likely consider (e.g. 8am – 4pm). We encourage input from people who don't currently use our service but who may do so if the hours were extended. Please fill in the slip below and return.

The fee model we would use would consist of 3 session charges. One for the short session, one for the main session, and one standard day charge for those that choose a longer day. We would continue to offer 20 hours ECE for 3- and 4-year-olds, so the short and main sessions would be free up to 20 hours. As is currently the case, children would be able to attend a mix of sessions in a week, and there would be no minimum number of days required.

We are conscious that having nappy-changing facilities would also be helpful for our families. Sadly we do not have the space for this in our current building, but our new building will have these facilities which will enable us to care for children younger than 2 years of age.

About Pukeko Preschool

We are a small rural preschool situated in the grounds of Tauwhare School on Scotsman Valley Rd. We are licensed for 17 children. We welcome children from 2 years of age. We don't have a minimum number of days required, which is a lovely way of settling in to preschool. There are 3 sessions available: 8.15am – 3.30pm; 8.45am – 2.45pm; 8.45am – 1.00pm.

“The Foot & Body”

“When My Feet Hurt, I Hurt All Over”

This is a statement millions of people will agree with.

In fact the foot does not even have to be painful to create problems in almost any part of the body. Within the foot there are many nerve receptors called Proprioceptors. Their purpose is to sense the position and movement of the foot and inform the rest of the body, insuring co-ordination of movement and position. If this did not happen when you move one leg, you would fall over as you walk. The ankle and toes of your back foot bend and stimulate the nerve sensors in the ankle, foot and toes, sending information up to the shoulders on the same side. This information causes the muscles in the back to relax and the muscles in the front to contract, so that your arm moves smoothly forward in synchronization with the body.

If the foot is not functioning normally the nerves are stimulated in a confused manner. They do not send the correct information. When this occurs the body works against itself causing joints to ache, muscular fatigue and strains. Ultimately the entire body becomes involved. As the neck becomes strained, headaches develop, vertebrae become misaligned which in turn can cause problems to the organs and glands that branch off the spine.

The foot is designed to move into over 150 different positions! And subject to constant pounding, twisting and wrenching during normal walking, turning and running. Even though the foot is subjected to these strains on a regular basis it can take it until it is subjected to poor or improperly fitted shoes, ankle sprains, or other foot injuries.

Balance starts at the base. Just like a Crane it needs stability. Even though the feet may not hurt, there may be subluxation in the bones that may be providing improper neurological information to your body.

When upright the body is reliant on the feet for balance and stability. If any of the 28 bones in the feet are incorrectly aligned the whole body is affected. LADIES A PLATE

Mocha Biscuits

125g Butter
125g Sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 teaspoons instant coffee

150g plain flour
1 teaspoon Baking Powder
pinch salt
chocolate buttons

Cream butter and sugar, add vanilla and coffee then fold in sifted flour, baking powder and salt. Roll into balls, press with wet fork and lightly press a chocolate button into the center of each biscuit

Bake at 180C for 10 – 15 minutes. Should be lightly browned. Makes about 20 biscuits.

Chocolate Crunch

1 cup plain flour
¾ cup brown sugar
1 large Tablespoon cocoa
1 teaspoon vanilla

1 cup coconut
4 crushed Weetbix
1 teaspoon baking powder

Put all dry ingredients into large bowl. Melt 175g butter, add the vanilla and pour over dried ingredients. Mix well and press into sponge-roll tin. Bake at 180C for 15 – 20 minutes. Cool then ice with chocolate icing and sprinkle with coconut.

New recycling crates ready for delivery

Brand new recycling crates will be delivered to Waikato district households later this month onwards as part of the new refuse and recycling services.

The new 55L teal blue recycling crates are being introduced as part of a range of measures to reduce the amount of waste sent to landfill in the Waikato district.

From July 1, a user-pays system will be introduced requiring residents to purchase pre-paid stickers for their refuse bags and in Tuakau pre-paid wheelie bin tags prior to collection. Raglan will continue with their pre-paid refuse bags. Waikato District Council General Manager Service Delivery, Tim Harty, says the overall aim is to encourage people to recycle more items, more often.

“We hope these new recycling crates will help people reduce the amount of waste they throw away each week. A guide will accompany each crate to explain the upcoming changes and to help people identify which items can actually be recycled.”

Over 25,000 new crates will be delivered from Friday 27 May onwards. Delivery of the new crates will be completed by the end of June. People are encouraged to hold onto, and continue using; their old recycling crates and up to three recycling crates per household will be collected each week from July 1.

“Each household that already receives a recycling collection will be given an additional crate. Residents in the north of the district who haven’t received a recycling collection before but receive a kerbside service will receive two crates,” Harty says.

“An astounding 64 per cent of waste currently sent to landfill in the Waikato doesn’t need to be there and could be put to better use,” Harty explains.

“Approximately 22 per cent of that is recyclable. Waikato District Council is committed to improving our recycling rates, working towards our zero waste targets and delivering these new crates is the first step towards achieving that goal.”

Quick Facts:

- 37% of the refuse sent to landfill in the Waikato district is currently kitchen waste
- 36% is organic/compostable waste
- 22% is items that are recyclable through the Council recycling service

NEWS FROM YOUR WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCILLOR



This week we adopted the Annual Plan (budget) for 2016/17 to be ratified at the full Council meeting in June. By not undertaking a formal AP consultation process one or two problems have arisen but it was a directive of Central Government that we have full consultation with submissions only once in 3 years as long as the Annual Plan did not change 'significantly' or 'materially' from the 2015-2025 Long Term Plan. We still prepared an Annual Plan but rather than preparing a consultation document we were able to better focus on Long Term Plan projects and better consult our communities on projects that affect them.

In summary –

- The operational targeted rates are unchanged from year two of the LTP
- The general rate and UAGC incremental increase is unchanged from year two of the LTP (2.84%)
- Anticipated debt is lower by \$6m

As I mentioned last month our **new rubbish and recycling service** comes into effect on 1 July. The cost of the service will be a targeted rate of \$127.83 (reduced from \$213.36) and \$1.50 per bag for solid waste. More information is on the Council website; alternatively I have a copy of our **Refuse and Recycling Guide and an Information Fact sheet** that includes a FAQ section. New recycling bins will be distributed from 27 May and more information on these is included in this edition of the *Express*.

Check out our **new website**, www.waikatodistrict.govt.nz, which should be easier to negotiate and view from a mobile phone or tablet. We now also have a **cemetery data base on line**. You can search for plots or memorials in the 22 District Council managed cemeteries and, by entering a person's name, you will be able to identify whether a person was buried or cremated, locate the position of a plot in the cemetery and view any headstone or memorial which is in place. If you find any incorrect information please let us know.

Dog registrations are now due and should be paid by 20 July. If you pay online prior to 20 July you will go into a draw to win a prize pack valued at \$250. A portion of each registration fee goes towards dog education in schools and dog control services in the district.

This week I am attending the **2016 Waikato Youth Awards** Ceremony at Hampton Downs. 52 young people were nominated and the awards are to recognise the work our young people do in their community.

The project team for the Hamilton section of the **Expressway** has been working on the detailed design and construction programme for the project. Over the next three months the contractors will be cutting access tracks, clearing vegetation and fencing etc. A full site office will be constructed once the work starts in earnest next year and will eventually house a visitor information centre where you will be able to learn more about the project.

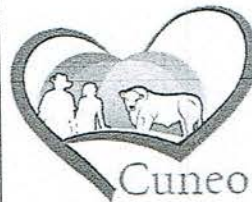

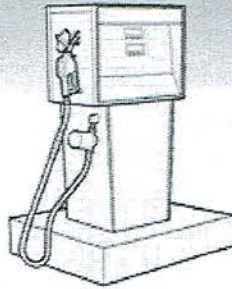
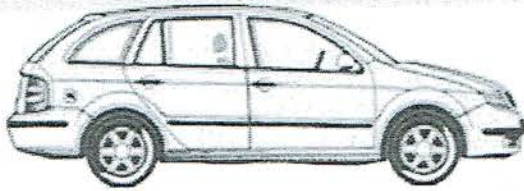
