

Editorial

Having grown up in a small rural community, I always had a hankering for life out of town. Maybe enough room for a couple of sheep and a few fruit trees, but nothing too intensive as I am not really an early morning person.

I moved to Hamilton in 2005, and shortly afterwards started working in Morrinsville. The daily commute along Highway 26 allowed me to spy all the houses en route, and got me to thinking that this would be the perfect area to live (one day at least). I often looked at the houses down The Avenue (I only learnt this name after moving into the area) bathed in rich afternoon sunlight during the depths of winter and the image was idyllic; maybe the essence of my own "Kiwi Dream".

Fast forward a few years; marriage, two children, my own business and a house in town, and the dream seemed to be edging slowly further away. My wife, Ripeka, and I often talked about moving onto a lifestyle block, and indeed had looked at a number of places around Hamilton, but with a growing family we needed something that would not be too much work landwise. The house needed to be able to grow with us as well. Then in April 2015, we happened upon a listing on TradeMe; the house had character and room for improvement, with just enough land to entertain the kids as they grew up. Importantly, it was in close enough proximity to both Hamilton and Morrinsville, as I had had enough of lengthy commutes (in non-Auckland terms at least), and my wife's family lives in Hamilton.

The house we bought was an old bungalow, previously owned by Tony Eccles, and this (possibly) had been subdivided from the Basi family farm in the 90s. It was strategically hidden behind a large conifer, and most people aren't aware that the house even exists, so this is possibly how we managed to avoid the "New Arrivals" section in the Eureka Express, although I was hoping that we would be found out and introduced at large to the community

And so we come to today, where after talking to a few people, I have decided (and been convinced) that it would be a good opportunity to introduce myself and my family. My name is Whare Noe, and I am a dentist who has been based in Morrinsville for just over 10 years. I am married to my lovely wife, Ripeka, a physiotherapist, and the mother to our 3 gorgeous children: Stevie-Lee (6), Hemi (4), and Willow, who turns 1 in November!

We have very much enjoyed living here for the last 15 months, and our kids seem to enjoy the wide open spaces that rural living affords; taking a goat to last year's agricultural day at Tauwhare School was a highlight for Stevie-Lee. She even managed to win some ribbons that she was so proud of! Both older children also enjoy heading outside to explore the section, riding loops around the house on their bikes, or hiding in the 'spooky forest' behind the garage. Even our cat, Shadow, enjoys living out here more than in town; many more birds to chase, and fewer big cats to be chased by!

We also knew that when we moved in, we were going to do some major renovations. Ripeka's parents graciously allowed us to live with them for almost 6 months, swelling their household from 2 people to 7(!) whilst the renovations were being done. Now they are mostly complete, with only a deck and some landscaping to do. I am however, interested in the history of the house as the council file is very thin on details. I was kindly directed by Lynne Brewer to the Eureka History E-book on the website, and informed that the house was owned by Norman Thompson (possibly moved on to site from Waihi by his father, Thomas), and this was subsequently sold to the Teagues. Other than this, there is little information about the house itself, and certainly no images. It is a dream that one day we will be able to restore the house to its original external appearance, with bay windows and all the bells and whistles that it may have had. What we would really appreciate is that if anybody has or knows anybody who has old photographs of the house, if we were able to have copies of these photos for reference and posterity. I believe it would make a great centrepiece for our house as it approaches its' own 100 years' anniversary.

Finally, I would like to thank our neighbours and all the members of the community for making us and our family feel welcome, and allowing us to call Eureka and the surrounding districts our home.





TASTE BUDS

KENTUCKY FRIED CHICKEN'S 11 Spices

- 1) 2/3 Tbs Salt
- 2) 1/2 Tbs Thyme
- 3) 1/2 Tbs Basil
- 4) 1/3 Tbs Oregano
- 5) 1 Tbs Celery Salt
- 6) 1 Tbs Black Pepper
- 7) 1 Tbs Dried Mustard
- 8) 4 Tbs Paprika
- 9) 2 Tbs Garlic Salt
- 10) 1 Tbs Ground Ginger
- 3 Tbs White Pepper



Grind and combine with 2 Cups Flour or breadcrumbs. (The mix will keep in a dry air tight container for about a month.)

Oil temperature 350 degrees.

Soak chicken in buttermilk and coat just once in the herb mixture.

KIWIFRUIT CRUMBLE (IN SEASON NOW)

6-8 Kiwifruit

1 cup of plain flour


1/2 cup of rolled oats or Ancient Grains is better

125g butter

1/2 cup of brown sugar

6 dried apricots finely sliced

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180 degrees Celsius.
- 2. Cut each kiwifruit in half and scoop out insides into an oven dish.
- Mash kiwifruit thoroughly.
- 4. Sprinkle over apricots.
- 5. Put dry ingredients into a mixing bowl.
- Then dice butter and add it to the dry ingredients.
- Combine butter with dry mixture by using your hands to rub it in until the mixture has a crumbly consistency.
- Pour topping on top of the kiwifruit and place in the oven for 30 minutes.
- When cooked serve immediately with ice-cream and/or custard and cream.
- 10. Enjoy.



NEWS FROM YOUR WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Council is now holding the last few meetings of this triennium with the final full Council meeting to be held on Monday 3rd October. As I mentioned last month, five nominees for Councillor were elected unopposed, four Councillors are not standing for re-election and seventeen nominees will contest elections for the other eight seats on Council. The first meeting of the new Council will be held in late October.

In mid September the voting papers were posted to all those on the electoral roll – if you have not received your voting papers contact the Electoral Office on 0800 922 822. If you are not on the roll you can still request special voting papers by enrolling on www.elections.org.nz, by phoning 0800 922 822 or by visiting any PostShop for an enrolment form.

Voting papers must be posted by Wednesday 5th October to be delivered to the Electoral Office by noon on Saturday 8 October or be delivered to a ballot box by the same deadline. Ballot boxes are at Council's main office, 15 Galileo Street, Ngaruwahia and the Huntly, Raglan and Tuakau offices / libraries and Te Kauwhata library.

Please take the opportunity to cast your vote. Eureka Ward residents will be voting for Mayor, Regional Councillors and Waikato DHB. No election is required for Ward Councillor as I was elected unapposed.

Council's **Annual Report** is due out in early November and a summary will be in the next issue of *The Link*. If you don't receive a copy of this bi-monthly newsletter in your mail box you can read it online. The latest version of *The Link* gives an **update on the new refuse and recycling changes.** It also focuses on guidelines around bag size as there is some confusion about the size and types of bags one can use for your solid waste.

Waikato has consulted 4,500 landowners during a year long process to identify 1,000 **Significant Natural Areas** (SNAs) including wetlands and peat lakes, lowland forest and kahikatea stands and coastal ecosystems. Most of the 1,000 SNA's are on private blocks. This year Council approved a grant for a Tauwhare landowner to purchase trees and plants to help the Wright's Bush Restoration Group to restore a block of private bushland adjoining Wright's Bush which supports many native species and is protected by a QE2 covenant.

With the huge number of roading works taking place in the Waikato during the Expressway build and the ongoing maintenance of our 1,830kms of sealed and 604kms of unsealed roads, Council are asking that road users respect the roading staff that work in all weathers on large and small projects. Council roading staff and District Alliance staff, particularly those in traffic management, are being abused on a daily basis. Temporary speed restrictions and traffic direction are important as the crews work to make our roads safer so please be patient, follow traffic management and drive safely.

I understand there are signs of work being started on the Ruakura Road section of the expresssway. Bridge construction is expected to begin in November with an earthmoving truck crossing opening in December, controlled by traffic signals. Up to 7000 motorists travel on Ruakura Road each day and the Project Alliance team will monitor the effects on traffic and manage its truck movements to keep traffic moving. By building the bridges early the Project Alliance can then run its earthmoving trucks under these bridges, rather than crossing busy local roads, which will minimise traffic impact.

To receive regular updates on the Expressway work sign up to receive the Expressway newsletter on www.nzta.govt.nz/hamilton. These newsletters are very interesting and, if you sign up during Sep/Oct, you and a friend can go in the draw to win a personal tour of the construction site including a ride on a dump truck. From Feb 2017 Expressway newsletters will only be on line and will include videos and 'one-click' links to the latest project photos and information.

On 23rd September councillors were invited to Rangiriri to a ceremony to mark the start of the symbolic restoration of the Rangiriri Paa – scene of the 1863 Battle of Rangiriri. The project is part of the Rangiri Section of the Waikato Expressway and the paa's restoration will see a section of the former SH1 in-filled and an interepretative recreation of the battle site built, complete with walkways and car parking.

Puketaha School celebrated its centenary on 23-24 September. It was a wonderful weekend catching up with friends from school days and past residents. Around 260 people, plus present pupils, were at the school on Saturday for the formal events and around 155 attended the dinner at Claudelands on the Saturday night. The Jubilee Committee organized a superb event and even the weather was kind.


