EDITORIAL

Hello everyone :-)

My name is Kerrie and I have been asked to write a little bit about myself for the Eureka Express.

So - I am a 47yr old single mother of four. I have a 23-yr, old son who is based in Rotorua but works all over NZ building truck depots and bridges for the Hamilton Expressway, a 21-yr, old son who works with me on the farm, and 14 yr, old twin girls who go to Morrinsville College.

We moved to Tauwhare in 2011 and I worked as 2IC for Darryn and Sharon Collins. After a year they moved to Australia and I began working at Bucklin Farms, where I still am today. I started here as a milk harvester and am now 2IC, Shed Manager and Health and Safety Officer. I am in charge of our first herd (360 heifers) and I run them on 98 hectares. I have done this for the past 3 years and absolutely love it. I have learnt so much more here than on any other farm I have worked on. I have learnt to ride a 2 wheeler motorbike, feed out on feed pad, and load up with a pay loader. I have completed level 4 Ag-Ito and am currently doing level 5 Production Management.

I love working with the animals most of all, cows are so beautiful and I don't know many people who get to work with their favourite animal every day. If someone had told me 10yrs ago, that I would be doing all the things I have learnt to do here I would have replied...."Maaayyte ya dreamin"

I have been in the farming community for 21 years, but not full time as I am here. I was always just a milker or calf rearer. My previous jobs were office clerk positions and a cook in kitchens, in restaurants and hospitals. Rhoda Read in Morrinsville was neat to work in

On a personal level, I try to spend as much time with my family as I can. I'm not keen on sports but prefer more "arty farty" kind of pursuits. I up-cycle old furniture or make things out of pallets, as does my son. I like to make other crafty things, and really enjoy cross stitching. As I get older, I am finding an interest in gardening too.

I love living in this area, I have wonderful neighbours and fantastic work mates. It's close to Hamilton and Cambridge, where the rest of my family are. Everything is just 10 minutes away and so convenient.

Did you know?

- Out of hospital cardiac arrest OHAC (heart stoppage) is New Zealand's 2nd biggest killer with 35 people a week, 1,800 per year having an OHCA
- Only 5% survive if nothing is done
- This improves to 15% surviving if CPR is started by a bystander as soon as it happens.
- If a 'public access' defibrillator (AED) is available and used before an ambulance arrives the patient's chances of surviving increases by 69%.

Cheryl willingly contributed her 'Heavenly Herbs' articles for a number of years, delivered countless issues along SH 26 over many years, and cheerfully helped on printings days whenever she could. Her bright, cheery and caring company is dearly missed.

To all Cheryl's family, friends and associates goes our deepest sympathy in their huge loss.

Little ole dairy farmers from Eureka – how we ended up on TV

Our Fonterra Area Manager Rosalie Piggott put a few farming family names forward that she thought would fit the brief for the TV advertisement. We got a call from Fonterra marketing asking whether we'd be interested and did a phone interview talking about our thoughts on Milk for Schools, our children etc. They phoned back the next day to ask if we'd do it and we jumped at the chance!

One of the reasons we were keen to be a part of it is that there is so much negativity out there about dairy farming. This was a good chance to help advertise some of the good Fonterra farmers are doing for the community. It was also a nice lesson for our kids to learn that not only are we dairy farming for a living, but we're also contributing to the greater good of the community. Charlotte liked the idea that we are sharing the milk from our own cows with her school friends.

A lot of the public are probably aware of Milk for Schools but don't know much about it, so it was a great opportunity to get the information out there, like the large volumes of milk donated by Fonterra farmers every day and recycling side of it benefitting offshore communities.

As parents of young children, we love the idea of Milk for Schools and believe it benefits our kids directly, not only through nutrition but also by filling hungry tummies making it easier for children to concentrate and learn.

It was a fun experience to be a part of, definitely something different for us! The fact that it wasn't 'acting' or speaking on camera made it easy. The audio was recorded while we sat in the lounge with a cup of tea and I answered the director's questions. It did feel a little bit strange as they had to be silent while I was talking, but they did try to make it as relaxed as possible.

The filming day was fun, although it did involve a lot of bribery to keep the kids on track. I was dishing out chocolate Santas at 7am!

We love the final result. We were a bit nervous about it...what did I say? ...what did I sound like? ...what did I look like? But we were really pleased with the final product, they did an amazing job of putting it together and we're really proud of it. It's something for the kids to look back on.

We were on holiday in Australia the day it launched, but we knew exactly when it was on TV for the first time because our phones went crazy with messages and missed calls!!!




WEATHER FOR JAN 2017

CO Comment for Eureka Express

Jaimee Morgan's Baby

Great Rain

Things were getting very dry by mid-February but the 100mm that most farmers got on the weekend of the 18th Feb was both welcome and game changing. The stars are beginning to line up for a change! Great mid-February rain, a lift in Fonterra's advance to \$4:85 paid on 20th March and the prospect of a \$6+/kg milk price have put smiles back on dairy farmers faces.

Break Even Milk Price

What milk price does your business need to break even or keep afloat? This is very farm specific and something we urge all farmers to know for their business. You would be amazed at the range out there. The lowest is around \$3:50 but the highest is around \$7:50. Ouch. The mean being around \$5:30. That is just to break even, not replace capital etc. That is one view on the risk profile of a business but another is the debt/kg MS. This ranges from 0 to a massive \$45/kg MS with the mean being around \$22. All these comments relate to farm owners.

With the volatility of milk price being the new norm, a dairy farm business needs to pitch their business at a milk price where they can manage within the risk factors at play. Expect banks to require more debt repayment as we move into a positive cash-flow era. So, tight farm and personal spending is still likely to be a key focus for many in the immediate future.

Autumn Reset

DairyNZ's focus, in support of farmers this Autumn, is to build into Discussion Groups an activity around resetting the business after 2 or 3 really difficult years. What lessons and habits can be retained? E.g. lower Farm Working Expenses. But what things need to change because they aren't sustainable as they are? E.g. farm maintenance or labour was pruned too low. In the first round we have used an exercise around the breakeven milk price. There are 5 numbers you need to know to calculate BEMP for your farm. The numbers here are simply an example.

This would not be a healthy place to be and so a business in this position would need to work on how they can reduce costs and/or debt in order to reduce exposure to risk.

NEWS FROM YOUR WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Happy New Year to you all. It is hard to believe Autumn is just around the corner. Jill and I enjoyed our break away during January despite the strong winds in the Bay of Plenty. Like you all — we welcomed the 120+ mls of rain last week.

We are back to work at Council now with a busy year ahead. The District Plan Review continues along with consideration of submissions to Easter Trading bylaws and developing the 2018-2028 Long Term Plan (LTP).

Our roading maintenance team works hard during the summer and they do their best to minimise disruption to traffic flows. Summer 2016-17 has been a very bad year for accidents on Waikato roads. Please adjust your driving to the traffic and weather conditions and reduce your driving speed.

The Waikato Expressway construction continues apace. Work in Eureka Ward includes:

 Bridge construction commencing on Puketaha Road and Powells Road July/August 2017 and Greenhill Interchange Aug/Sep 2017. Ruakura Rail Bridge to be completed Nov/Dec 2017, Embankments under construction at the Ruakura Interchange and bridge construction to begin May/June 2017. Bridge piling in progress on Morrinsville Road with the bridge to to be completed Aug/Sep 2017 and Matangi Road bridge construction beginning May/June 2017. Water tankers are working constantly to prevent dust being blown off the project sites.

Many of the bridges on the Hamilton Section will be built "top down" They are built on the ground and then the expressway route will be excavated beneath. To see how this process works, read the project newsletter on the NZTA Website - Hamilton Section www.nzta.govt.nz/hamilton. The NZTA Expressway Visitor Centre is being opened on Saturday 4th March from 10am - 1pm at 164 Percival Road, Ruakura (turn right off Ruakura Road [travelling towards University], into Ryburn Road then left into Percival Road.) They will continue to open on the first Saturday of each month while they have sufficient visitor numbers. Also a Project Open Day will be held from 10am - 3pm on Saturday 1 April at the Project Office on Percival Road

Waikato District Council has created a dog agility park using recycled playground equipment at Horotiu on the corner of Horotiu Road and Great South Road - this has been very popular with dog owners. A 'doggy fun day' will be held at Horitui Dog Park on Saturday 11th March from 10am to 2pm. There will be a sausage sizzle, entertainment and spot prices for the dogs. The District will be creating more agility parks as other playgrounds are removed.

The Eureka Express Committee is taking the excellent ititiative to install a defibrilator unit (AED) at the Eureka hall and will launch this on Sunday 19th March at 1pm. Details are in this Express – join the Committee to learn how to use this vital piece of equipment and brush up on your CPR skills. Hope to see you there.

As part of the country wide Pedal for Plunket event - on Saturday 11th March from 10am to 2pm the Avantidrome and Cycling NZ crews are teaming up with the Warehouse and Plunket to bring a Family Wheels Day to Cambridge. The day begins at the start of the Te Awa Cycleway by the Gaslight Theatre in Cambridge at 10pm to pedal, scoot or push your way to the Avantidrome. Or just meet at the Gallagher Bike Skills Park behind the Avantidrome for fun and games, spot prizes, and barbecue with an opportunity to meet special guests Alison Shanks and Nikki Hamblin.
