Now we drive our kids everywhere in and out of town sometimes twice a day to give them experiences in their chosen sports. We will miss the locality of Eureka when we move to what might be called the wop wops again near Hobbiton.

We hope to find a great community up there like here and perhaps a slower pace of life although this never eventuates for Rach and I as we seem to fill up any space with another activity for Us or and the kids. So, for now it is goodbye but we will not be strangers.



Waitakaruru Stream:

Riperian Planting

Early next month we will be Early next month the whole school will get an opportunity to go to the Portegys farm to participate in tree planting. It is a chance for the children to learn about how riparian margins protect our waterways, different plants and where they should be planted in a riparian margin.

Kids Teaching Kids

The senior children are doing intensive research into Water and sustainability. Linda Cook and Sharon Quinn are taking 8 senior students, who will represent their peers, to present at the Kids Teaching Kids Conference in Melbourne in October this year. Exciting times!!!!!

Kid's Lit Quiz

Year 6 children, Ella Cooney, Edie Sharman, Zahedyn Cutler and Kinnon Broekhuizen represented our school in the Kid's Lit Quiz held at Southwell School. There were 65 teams representing the Waikato-Bay of Plenty region. This was all about the sport of reading and involved 10 quizzes on different themes around a wide range of literature. Our team did really well and earned 64.5 points.

Congratulations to the very many children who have been selected for trials in their various codes. And thank you to the coaches and managers of our 20 sports teams – it's your great coaching that gets our children to this level.

Pukeko Preschool – June 2017

Some of our families are taking part in a University research project about rural children and their empathy for animals. Halimah has been coming in once a week with books and joining us in the forest as the children search for small critters. 

IN YOUR GARDEN



What is the hidden meaning of your favourite rose colour?

Throughout his tory, different rose colours have held different meanings. Although selective breeding allows roses to come in almost every colour today, roses in the wild only grow in reds, whites, yellows and pinks. When you choose a rose plant either for yourself or others, be aware of the hidden symbolism each rose colour carries.

- Red roses let someone special know that you deeply appreciate and love them. Red roses are
 associated with love, romance, passion and beauty.
- Traditionally used as wedding flowers, white roses symbolise purity, innocence and unity. White
 roses are also associated with reverence and are often used as a gesture of remembrance.
- Yellow roses are associated with platonic love, joy and appreciation. Throughout history they have been recognised as a symbol of friendship.

Dark pink roses are associated with gratitude and celebration; mid pink roses symbolise admiration, elegance and gentleness; and pale pink roses are associated with sympathy.

Roses named after famous people

Many people have had roses named after them to honour and celebrate their lives and Roach's for Roses stocks a choice selection of these beautiful namesakes. Russian ballet dancer Anna Pavlova and Winston Churchill, former Prime Minister of the UK, have roses named after them. Eleanor Roosevelt has a rose named after her called Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt.

Princess Diana has a rose named after her, called Princess of Wales. This Hybrid Tea shrub rose is lightly fragrant and has beautiful, long stems. This rose flowers continuously throughout spring and early summer and was developed in 1998 by Zary.

Sir Edmund Hillary has a climbing rose named after him. This rose is a fragrant plant with blooms of pure white with a golden centre.

New Zealand singer Hayley Westerra gives bername to a bush rose with double shades of apricot and highlights of cream and peach Claude Monet has a Hybrid Tea rose named after him, with big yellow and pink blooms. This hardy rose resists diseases and is striking in appearance.

SCAM WARNING

Hi Residents of Eureka

I've recently noticed a rise in the number of clients telling me they've had a random call from someone with a foreign accent telling them they've got a security or other issue with their computer.

Here's how the scam works:

They call you (sometimes bounced through a NZ landline number) and tell you there's a security or other problem with your computer.

- . If you capitulate, they tell you to do a bunch of things on your computer, which gives them access.
- They then access your computer and do some stuff on screen, while in the background installing a programme which they can use to control your computer at a later point.
- . They tell you they can fix the problem, but it'll cost X amount of money.
- If you don't pay, they'll bombard you with calls telling you the problem is still there and they need
 to fix it.
- If you ignore this, they use the tool they installed to lock your computers o you can't use ittypically after a certain period of time, like a month.

If you or anyone you know has gone along with their instructions, you need your computer checked out pronto. Feel free to call me on 021 1348576.

If not, here's the best way to deal with these critters:

- 1. Record the phone call and take down the phone number if you can.
- 2. After stringing them along for a minute or two, tell them you know they're a scammer and hang up on them.
- 3. Don't answer any further calls from them.
- Report the incident to your phone service provider, or to Spark (https://store.spark.co.nz/forms/s/phone-scam-report).

Obviously if you've called someone for computer support, that's different. Unsolicited calls about your computer are always scams.

From the reports I've been getting, looks like Waikato in particular is targeted at the moment. The more that our people can mislead and annoy these people, and get their numbers blocked, the more likely it is the scammers will stop this.

Over the centuries there have been many other descriptions for this such as racket, trick, diddle, con, flim flam, gyp, kite, ramp, twist, hustle, grift, shakedown, bunco, boondoggle and rort. A person who uses a scam is a dishonest swindler or fraudster. Scams are deceptive, uninvited contacts or promises designed to trick you into giving away your money or your personal information.

Here are just a few of the many different types of SCAMS: Dating and Romance; Investment; Upfront Money; Online Auction; Computer Hacking; Betting Schemes; Employment; Holiday; Mail Order; Rent; Get Rich Quick; Nigerian Fee, Prize Notification; Phishing; and Mobile Phone SCAMS.

The following organisations can arm you with a great deal more detailed information about SCAMS and how to AVOID and report them. Important advice on what to do after being SCAMMED is also available.

TASTE BUDS

Some great easy winter warmers for the colder days and nights

Curried Kumara Soup

75 grams butter
2 Cloves garlic
½ - 1 tsp curry powder
500grams kumara
1 ½ cups water
2 tsp inst. Chicken stock
About 3 cups milk
¼ cup cream (optional)



Add the crushed garlic and curry powder to the butter in a large saucepan. Peel kumara and slice in 1 cm thick slices. Cook in the butter without browning, for 1 – 2 minutes then add water. Cover and cook for 10 minutes until tender. Stir in the chicken stock, then puree, thinning with milk. Add the cream and reheat without boiling.

Chicken Casserole

1 cooked Chicken
1 tin of raw mushrooms
1 onion
Celery
1 tsp curry powder.
1 packet Maggi chicken soup
1 small tin of pineapple pieces
½ green pepper
½ grated carrot
Garlic



Break up chicken off bones and add rest of ingredients. Increase liquid to cover with chicken stock or water. Thicken with comflour if necessary.

Flaked Rice Fluff

3 tbsp flaked rice 2 tsp sugar 2 cups milk 1 egg

Heat milk and rice together until it thickens. Add sugar and egg yolk beaten together with a little milk and heat (do not boil). Beat egg whites until stiff and fold into cooked mixture. Serve with stewed fruit. Semolina, sago etc can be substituted in this recipe.

I think so!!!; I also think it makes Aunts 'Associate Research Assistants.'



NEWS FROM YOUR WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Every two years Waikato District Mayoral Awards are presented, recognising volunteers and residents who have made a significant contribution to their community.

The 2017 award ceremony was held recently and this year awards were presented to eleven district residents including Barry Mayall from Eureka and Ivan and Delia Pizzini from Tauwhare. It was a privilege to see Barry, Ivan and Delia being recognised for the contribution they have each made, and are still making, to their respective communities.



In January this year Council successfully applied to the Ministry of Social Development for funding to support youth action groups and for young people to mentor each other. "Govern Up" is a programme that will allow young people in communities to join a local youth action group to develop and use leadership skills and to participate in youth-led projects and events. Forty-seven young people are already participating out of a target of 60. A key challenge for Council's Youth Engagement Advisor Shannon Kelly has been to service a larger geographical area with the youth action groups tending to be based around the larger towns in the district with established youth networks. At this time, we have no youth action group in the southern end of the district and Shannon has had little or minimal relationship building with our communities, schools and young people. We hope to use the information from existing groups to help us create youth groups and further leadership opportunities for young people.

I have just received the latest Expressway newsletter from NZTA which mentions that the first of the bridge beams will be put in place later this month. The Gordonton Road bridge will have 16 beams, each one 31 metres long, weighing 50 tonnes. It will be the first bridge completed on the Hamilton Section and should be open to traffic around August this year. Earthworks will recommence in October 2017 and by that stage the bridges on Osborne Road, Gordonton Road, Morrinsville and Matangi Roads will be finished. The bridges are completed early to allow the dumptrucks and earthmoving equipment to move earth from one site to the next going under or over local roads and railtracks.
