

EDITORIAL

My name is Renier Arts and I work for James and Stephanie King on their 600 cow dairy farm bordering Craig and Hinton Roads with my fiancée, Pam who works in Morrinsville for Vercoe Insurance Brokers.

Born in Putaruru to Dutch immigrant parents in 1955, I have always thought what a challenge it must have been for all these people who left Europe in the 1950s for Australia and New Zealand in search of new opportunities and a better life.

Educated at St Mary's Primary and Putaruru High School, I left the comfort of home to start a Civil Engineering Draughting Cadetship with the Ministry of Works, Wellington, in January 1974. I spent 6 months at the Draughting School learning basic Engineering Draughting skills and attending Polytech. At the conclusion of the course, as a group, we were assigned to Ministry of Works offices throughout New Zealand.

I was assigned to the Power Division offices in Wellington where I produced working drawings for the Huntly Power Station and the Upper Waitaki Power Development, Twizel, including the Ruataniwha Dam, Ohau and Tekapo Power Stations and Canals under the guidance of Engineers and Architects.

In October 1977 I was transferred to Cromwell where I spent 8 years producing construction plans for the Clyde Dam, Cromwell redevelopment and the formation of Lake Dunstan. During this time I met my wife, Debbie (now deceased) and had 2 daughters, Hannah and Emma. In January 1986 I gained a promotion to draughtsman in charge at Ohaaki Power project, Taupo where I stayed to the conclusion of the project in November 1989.

At this time the so called 'Think Big' projects had come to an end so, as employees, we were offered redundancy or the opportunity to apply for vacancies with the Ministry of Works. I chose a career change and in November 1989 with daughter number 3 (Charlotte) on the way, we moved to St Peters School Cambridge where I started as a farm assistant for the school's then 50/50 share-milker.

We gained our first 50/50 share-milking job in June 1991 and in June 1995 bought our 80ha, 240 cow farm in Rangitoto (between Te Kuiti and Otorohanga).

In May 2004 we sold the farm, a lifestyle choice and the opportunity for my wife to spend some time closer to her family after spending years following me around the country, so we moved to Nelson. Unfortunately, in July 2005 my wife became ill with a condition known as Transverse Myelitis (Neurological Disorder that effects the spinal cord). While not a life threatening condition, but due to complications, Debbie passed away in August 2005, 2 weeks after her 45th birthday. "SHIT' happens every day to many people but when it happens to you and your family you appreciate how precious life is.

The following 4 years were not my best, but in early 2010, after a phone conversation with a mate I decided to return to the Waikato and farming.

I worked for Russell and Tracey for a season at Okoriore and then started with the Kings in June 2011. Coincidentally, Russell was the farmer killed on a Puketaha farm in August 2015.

So 6 years on I am happy with my 'lot', looking forward to my wedding in January 2018, watching my 4 grandchildren grow up and spending quality time with my 3 adult daughters, adult step-daughter and son and their families.






To the Readers, Students and Researchers of Eureka



Earlier this month every household will have received a letter from the District Council about LIBRARY FACILITIES.

At present all our ratepayers have free access to all the Public Libraries run by Hamilton City Council, under a contract agreement that WDC has had for the last decade with HCC, and also with the Waipa Council.

If you bothered to read the letter you would have discovered that any libraries run by WDC itself are located many kilometres from Eureka (Ngaruawahia would be the nearest).

So free access to the Hamilton libraries, particularly Hillcrest and, when we get it back, the Central Library, is a benefit we should treasure, however many or few books we borrow, and their other services we use. If we lose this benefit it will be a significant loss to all those living long distances from any WDC libraries.

Having lived in Hamilton during the 70s and early 80s, weekly trips with my kids to the library in Worley Place and, later also to the mobile library when it called at Chartwell, were highly valued experiences, even then. When I returned to the Waikato in 1997, I found there were now libraries everywhere, and the fact that Eurekans could use them free was treasured.

OK, I'm one who reads a lot of all sorts of books. I'm a frequent visitor to the Hillcrest Library, a member of their lively Book Chat group and have got to know all the folk who work there, who are always very helpful in finding me stuff I'm keen to get hold of.

I don't know how many other Eurekans use Hamilton's libraries, but I'm sure our school and university students, plus older residents, value getting free membership, and have access to the very considerable resources available. I'm pretty sure that the resources at WDC libraries, even if they weren't miles away, won't be quite the same.

There are plebeians on every Council, including those on HCC who have been putting off doing anything with the Central Library's earthquake fixup. A number of WDC Councillors probably don't realise what losing our library cards would be like for those of us living in the south of the District. They would still have a library, and wouldn't notice a difference.

This belt tightening would also affect those living in the Waipa side of the district. Even with the third option put forward, we'd still find it difficult to actually collect any e-books, and a mobile library would never be around our way when we needed it, given the area it would have to cover.

So, we have until 3 November (any minute now) to either find the Council letter and form, or get onto the website and find it there <u>www.waikatodistrict.govt.nz/sayit</u> - or view the 'Say it' page, to get our protests in or views heard by WDC.



Backing up your data

So, it's that time of year again, and you're ready to get rid of some of that spring clutter. Of course you are. But, before you go deleting all the things you *think* you don't need, maybe you should invest some time in installing precautions, in case you get it wrong. For the fact is, we're all fallible, we make mistakes, that's what being human is about. So with that in mind, I'm going to talk to you about backing up.

Now, backing up isn't as simple as it seems. It's like sales: location, location, location. Where you back up to, is often as important as how often you do it - speaking of which, sometimes people back up fortnightly, sometimes weekly, sometimes daily, but mostly, not at all. And that's the most unfortunate thing.

Because here's all things which backing up your data protects you from:

- Power issues blackouts and brownouts if your power switches off randomly, or you
 get low power suddenly, the hard drive can make a mistaken write which can screw up
 your data. If you're like me and live in the country, you know how unstable power can be.
 A tree comes down and knocks out a power-line 15 miles down the road, and boom there goes your power.
- User error deleting or altering your own files.
- Viruses specifically, cryptolocker viruses and other kinds of malware which prevent you from accessing your files, or which delete them.
- Hardware failure a failing motherboard, CPU, power supply, faulty RAM or an old hard drive can make you lose data. Hard drives (the bit of your computer which stores data permanently) have a median lifespan of about 6 years, and a quarter die within the first four years. So don't think your computer is necessarily robust and permanent - it's not.
- Theft so long as you keep your backup drive elsewhere in the house.
- · Lightning strike to local power or phone lines.

The best location for backing up data is an external drive; backing up online as well is fine, but it's nowhere near as fast or convenient to restore data from 'the cloud' as it is to do so from a USB drive. A USB stick (flash drive) is also fine, if the amount of data you have is not large. Both are cheap to buy nowadays, particularly the sticks, so you've got no excuses there. BTW, it's not okay to backup up data to another location inside the computer. You are not protected from any of the above if you do so. Similarly, it's not okay to leave the backup drive plugged into the computer at all times. Disconnect the drive (click the "Safely remove hardware and eject media" icon in the bottom right-hand corner of the screen in windows, or drag the drive to the trash on a mac) and unplug it from the computer once you've finished backing up. If you're concerned about burglars or kids, store it somewhere out of sight.

Lastly, what software should you use to back up with? Windows' own backup setup used to be pretty bad, however with Windows 7 and later it's relatively good. You can follow the windows prompts for setting up a backup, or use Time Machine if you're on a mac. If you want a more comprehensive solution, or you want to back up manually, there are two options that I recommend: Crashplan is a paid application with a free version, which can back up online as well as to an external drive. Microsoft's own "synctoy" is also a program I quite like - it's simple, it doesn't copy anything that doesn't need to be copied, and it's free. If you want to take a look at either of them, google their names.

If you need any help with setting up a backup, or if you're unsure as to how to set one up yourself, give me a call. I'm always available to figure out a solution. Cheers.



CO COMMENT FOR EUREKA EXPRESS

Well it's great to be back in full swing at DairyNZ catching up with everyone after 8 months leave spending time with my little boy Cooper. Firstly, it was neat to see all the painted cows in the paddocks in the lead up to mating with a significant increase in the number of farms doing pre-mating heats this year. A low cost, highly beneficial method to ensure mating success. Then, after congratulating dairy farmers on their efforts with calf loading facilities, 2 rounds of discussion groups & an FEI workshop with Fonterra, it seems the sun has finally begun to make more of a daily appearance after a very long wet spring!

Pasture utilisation has been very difficult for most, so any decent pasture growth we have had this spring has been offset, with pasture surpluses proving difficult to find this year. A good way to judge is from the pre-grazing cover. Is the next paddock longer than what's needed to adequately feed the cows? Will the grazing residual be achieved? Too much grass left in the paddock is one sign of a surplus, but there are other signs to consider. Will the cows be adequately fed if some paddocks are missed for silage? Will the resulting rotation length be sustainable? Use this formula for determining what pre-grazing cover is required before a surplus is possible:

Stocking rate (cows/ha) x daily pasture intake (kgDM/cow) x rotation length (days) + grazing residual (kgDM/ha) = target pre-grazing cover (kgDM/ha).

 $3.0 \text{ cows/ha} \times 16 \text{kgDM/cow} \times 28 \text{ days} = 1344 + 1500 \text{ residual} = 2844 \text{kgDM/ha}.$

Also expect the consequences of wet conditions in achieving target grazing residuals to show up now. In poorly grazed pastures it's easy to find elongated stems as plants change towards reproduction. Some plants are showing aerial tillering resulting from incomplete grazing in earlier rotations. The mower may have to be sharpened to get these paddocks back to target residual.

Keep the vigilance around heat detection going as mating is just a third completed. The second and third cycles are often more difficult for heat detection as fewer cows are participating in heat activity. A plan for the unmated cows to date is required. This should include listing them based on days since calving, age, body condition score and any related health issues. From this listing, cows that are priorities for any treatment are determined, versus those that can be left to do their own thing. Using short gestation semen can help recover some days in milk for later mated cows, but remember that cows still must be cycling first and then detected on heat for short gestation semen to have any impact.

Scouring Calves - may not be worms!

Scouring calves after weaning could have Coccidiosia, Yersiniosia, or Salmonella or Cryptospirdia. If your yearlings are scouring bring in some faecal samples from the worst affected so we can test them for worms, Coccidiosis and Yersiniosis. The testing for worms or Coccidia is not an expensive test and you will have results within 24 hours. Coccidia is neither a bacteria nor worm, but a protozoa which invades the lining of the large intestine where they do their damage. They are unaffected by worm drenching. The most effective treatment is drenching with a product called Baycox.

Yersinia and salmonella are bacteria which is again unaffected by worm drenching.

The cost of Coccidiosis.

Normally the first sign you have that your calves have Coccidiosis is scouring but diarrhoea doesn't have to be present. In 95% of cases there is no diarrhoea. Coccidiosis can set back calves growth by as much as two months. As well it can increase their susceptibility to other diseases. After a 1 year affected calves can weight up to 27kg less and their potential for production and reproduction in adulthood is compromised.

Calves and Worm Drench

It's that time of year again, when your calves are getting ready to be weaned! You need to be thinking about what type of worm drench you want to be using and when.

The facts:

- Worms can't actually establish in the gut until calves have a fully functioning rumen. The
 process of worm larvae developing through to the adult stage requires rumen fluid as a
 trigger.
- The ill effects we see from gut worms (scouring and weight loss) are largely a consequence of the calf's own immune response to the 'invading' worms, and very young calves lack the capacity to mount this response, it kicks in later.
- Lung worm has a much longer lifecycle than the gut worm and even if a lungworm challenge is present it will rarely have risen to levels that require treatment in the period before weaning unless weaning is later than normal.

So What To Use?

<u>Corporal</u> (Same as Arrest C) is a dual combination oral drench for cattle best used on calves 2-4 weeks after weaning, then monthly. It is extremely cost effective, costing as little as 41 cents / calf / dose (excl GST), based on a 120kg dose!

If you'd rather use a pour-on <u>Boss Pour-On</u>* is the better one as it has the same active ingredient as Corporal (levamisole) combined with Abamectin (Genesis).

This product is excellent for calves sharing grazing at run-offs and is also great for Heifer replacements. It is also available in an injection.

*DO NOT USE ON CALVES LESS THAN 4 MONTHS OF AGE OR LESS THAN 100KG!

NEWS FROM YOUR WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

I hope you all managed to get a break during the long weekend. The weather where I was in the Bay of Plenty wasn't very warm but it was dry enough to get out for some fresh air and enjoy a change of scenery.

Are you aware that for the last decade Waikato District Council has had an arrangement with Waipa District Council and Hamilton City Council to allow our ratepayers to have **free access to all their libraries**? That arrangement costs more than \$300,000 a year.

Council is now reviewing this arrangment and recently sent out a "Future of our Libraries" survey to all ratepayers. If you would like to retain this service I urge you to complete the survey, Option 1 being the status quo, and return it to Council by 8pm on 3 November. Eureka Community Committee Chair Sue has also mentioned this review in an article in this issue of the *Express*.

I have mentioned previously that we have been preparing the **draft of our District Plan**. This is now ready for feedback, so we are holding a series of drop in sessions to talk about the key issues that may effect your property, community and / or the whole district. The session for Eureka and Tamahere Wards will be held at the **Tamahere Community Centre on Wednesday 6th December – any time between 2pm and 7pm**. I will remind you of the date and time again in next month's Express.

If you travel along Gordonton Road to Rototuna you will have noticed the temporary speed restrictions in the area around the **Gordonton / Thomas Road intersection**. This is a major black spot for accidents with 12 crashes in the first nine months of 2017.

I noticed yesterday that the temporary speed signs have now been replaced with a variable sign which appears to change the speed limit down from 80km when traffic is approaching the Thomas Road end of the intersection – similar to the system that alerts Holland Road drivers that cars are approaching from Telephone and Marshmeadow Roads. Hamilton City Council are responsible for Gordonton Road and are working on a permanent solution to this black spot.

Please slow down when driving anywhere near this intersection.

Reminder - the official opening of the Te Awa River Ride's new Perry Bridge is on Thursday 2nd November from 3:30pm - 6:30pm. All ages are welcome and admission is free.
