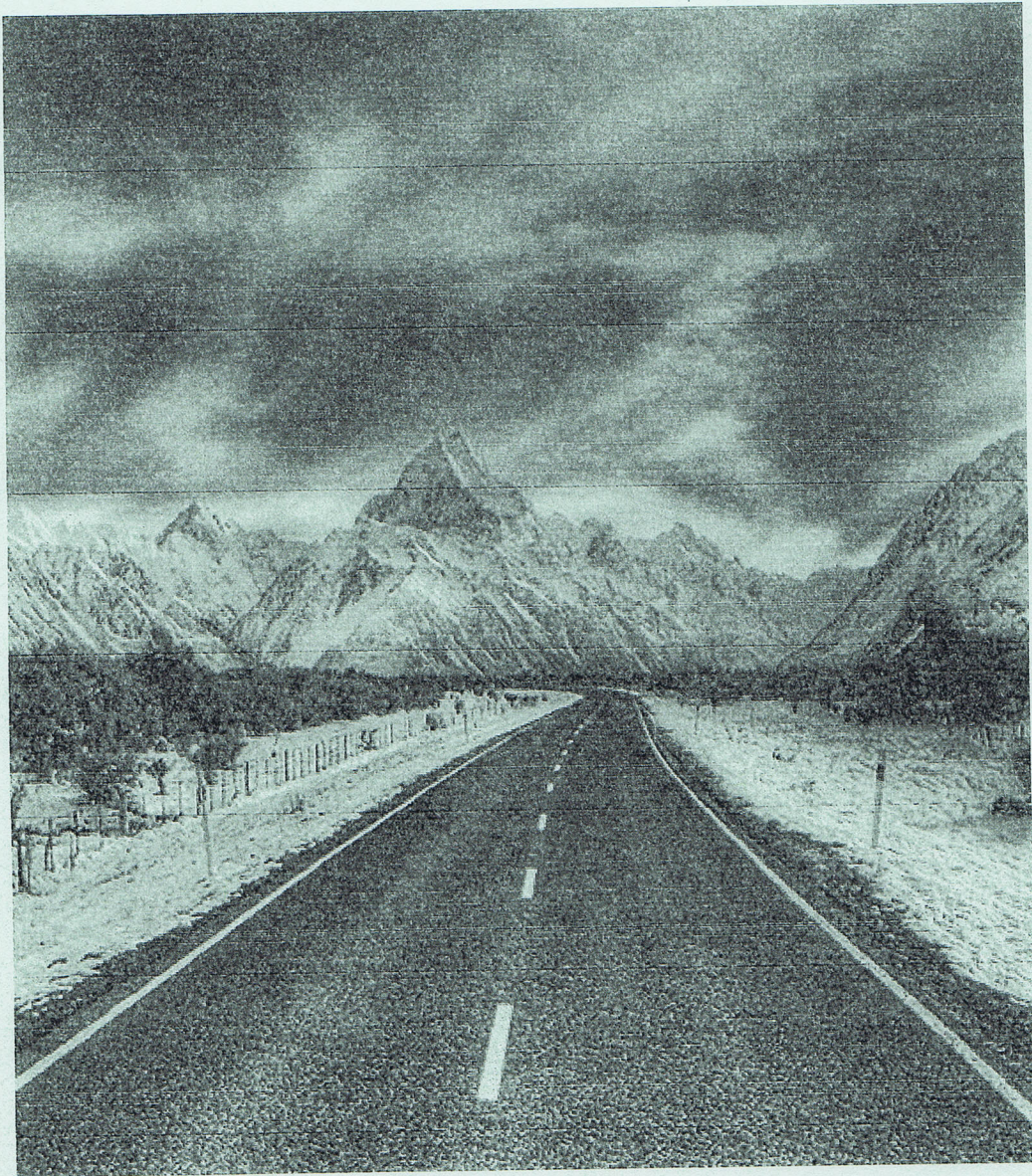

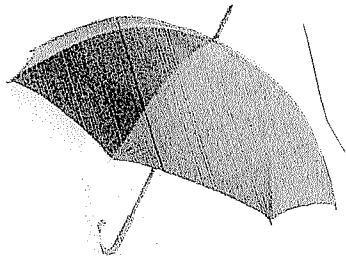
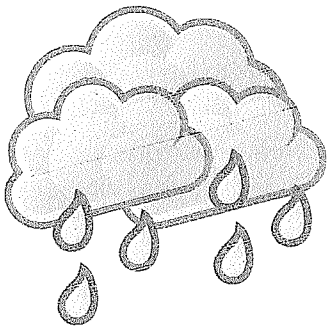
When we finished school we both moved to Hamilton where I studied HR and Human Development at Waikato Uni while Luke started his Building Apprenticeship.

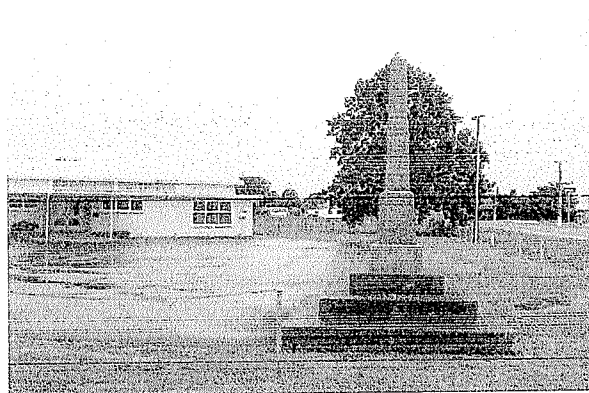

TAUWHARE INDOOR BOWLING CLUB

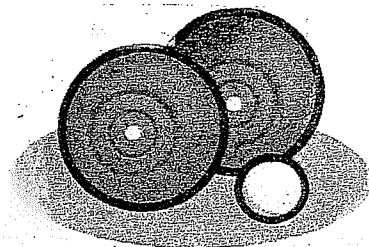
Welcome to June club news.

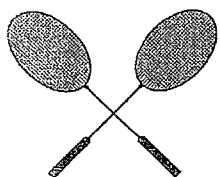
The handicap singles were played on the 7th June and Emily Stevens, who is one of our junior members, won the night and Kevin Williams was runner up.

We do have another family night coming up so it would be good to see some of the people again that came to our first family night and of course any others that would like to come along.

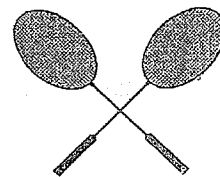

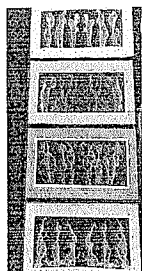


I was so impressed with their commitment, enthusiasm and dedication to excellence.

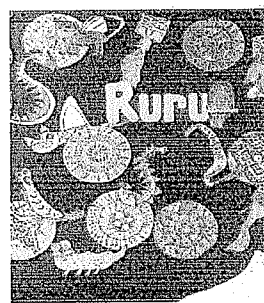
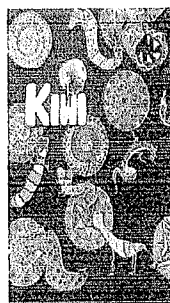


Kiwi And Ruru Classes Art Works. String Art

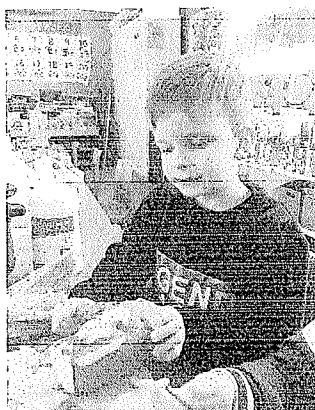
Created by painting a piece of string using warm and cool colours and then pulling it through folded paper.

Matariki Soup



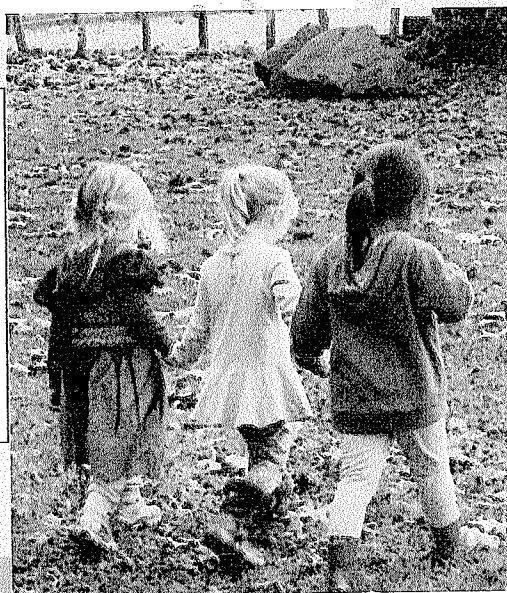

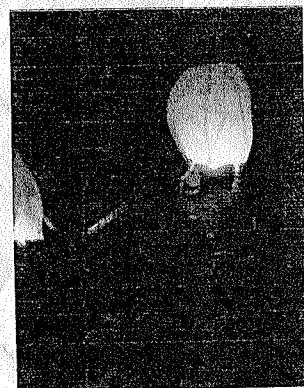
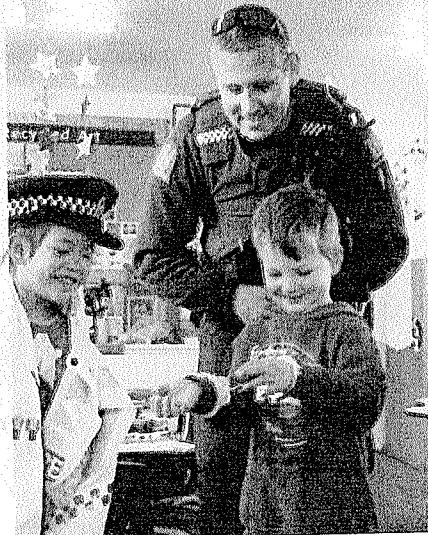
Notice of AGM

Tauwhare Playgroup

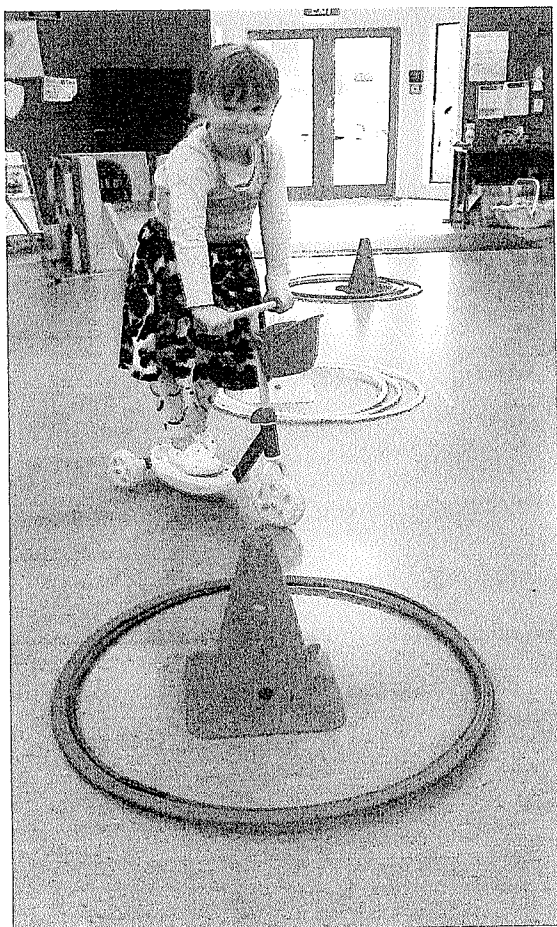

We have a some exciting sessions planned over the next few weeks, but are always open to suggestions. If you have any ideas that you think our playgroup members would enjoy, please let us know.

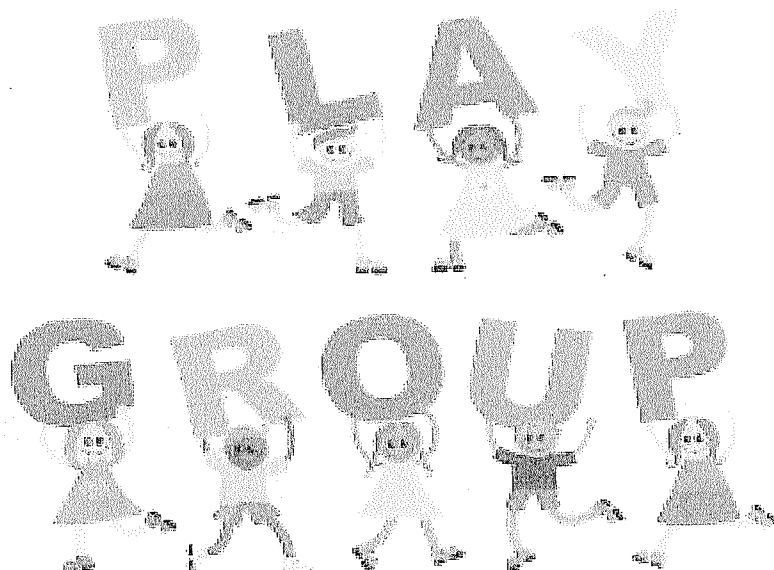
Keep up to date with what we are up to via our Facebook page as this is updated weekly with proposed activities or outings.

TASTE BUDS

"BEST EVER HEALTHY" PUMPKIN SOUP

4 Bacon rashers chopped
2 large Onions
1 KG Pumpkin
2 medium Potatoes
1 ltr Chicken stock

Herbs: Tbs: Basil, Thyme, Sage, Oregano, Turmeric,
Salt and Pepper to taste
Nutmeg
4 tbs white wine
400ml Cream

Sauté bacon, onion and herbs in either a tiny little butter or olive oil. Cook pumpkin and potatoes just covered in boiling water. When cooked retain all and put the water in a saucepan with a litre of chicken stock and 200mls of the cream. Smash up the pumpkin and potatoes, then add it all into the stock, including the bacon and onions. Bring to the boil and simmer 5 mins. Add wine, and salt and pepper to taste.
Serve topped with whipped cream and a sprinkle of nutmeg..... Enjoy!!

"HEALTHY COLD AND FLU" SPICY CHICKEN NOODLE SOUP

1 Package of Angel Hair Pasta
2 ltr Chicken Broth
250 grms Chicken breasts chopped into bite size pieces
1 piece of fresh Ginger cut into chunks.

6 cloves of Garlic chopped
1 tsp chilli flakes
4 Spring onions chopped fine

Place pasta into a heatproof bowl, cover with boiling water and set aside.
Combine in a large saucepan; Broth, garlic, ginger and chilli. Bring to the boil, reduce to low and cook for 10 mins. Add chicken pieces and cook until chicken is no longer pink in the centre. Drain the noodles and add to the soup. Stir well with a fork and remove ginger pieces. Serve topped with spring onions.
This soup can relieve nasal congestion and irritated airways.....Enjoy !!



IN MY GARDEN



Finally I am putting pen to paper. Already half way through the year. Farmers have had their ups and downs with weather too. I noticed a lot of farms have had trees removed for firewood or they are just too old, so have been dropped and burnt or cut up.

What I don't see is a replanting of shelter for stock against strong winds or small lots of trees planted for the environment etc.

It is a known fact that tree planting on farms not only contributes to a cleaner environment, but can improve property values as much as 25%.

Back to gardening. Winter vegetables should be planted and producing. It's not too late to plant cabbages, cauliflowers, broccoli, strawberry plants and many more. Pansies and polyanthus etc, will still give you a great show in the garden.

It's planting time for rose plants, fruit trees, including citrus, deciduous trees, hedge plants - anything that's not frost tender should be planted NOW.

Roach's have all the above in the next few weeks. Popular trees are ready to plant now, for stock shelter hillside stability etc.

There are 6 varieties which are strong bare root plants, up to 3m high - up to 50 = \$3.50+gst each 51 or more \$3.00+gst each.

Our new seasons citrus, about 8 different varieties, will be available early July. Vegetable and herb plants are ready now, all outside and hardy plants, ready for your garden.

Our mushroom compost is weed and bark free, available in bags or trailer. We will deliver on request.

Recycling – where and how?

I recently made a post on neighbourly.co.nz about recycling computers which got a lot of feedback and response. I thought I'd expand upon that by giving some general directions for recycling, not just computers, but electronic equipment and other kinds of materials. As I noted in that post, Dave from RecycleIT in Frankton (www.recycleit.co.nz, 0276295000) is the man to talk to if you've got some old computer equipment you're looking to get rid of. It doesn't matter whether or not it's working. He will reuse, recycle and/or strip computer equipment for parts, and in some cases will even do pick-up's from your address.

The caveat to that is CRT monitors and TV screens (the big old clunky ones). Those need to be taken into the dump shop at the refuse centre (the dump) in Frankton, where a \$5 fee will ensure they are recycled properly (this style of monitor contains many harmful substances like lead and mercury). As far as I know these are not taken with the inorganic rubbish collections. Other electronics, like metal waste in general, can be taken into most metal recyclers and exchanged for a bit of pocket change – I personally use Scrap Palace in Hamilton. This includes items like dishwashers, stereos and rusty old heaters.

As for the rest, here's places to take stuff:

Batteries (car or otherwise): Most metal recyclers will take these.

Clothing/Toys/Bikes/etc: I tend to drop off to the Sallies, but there's Hospice shops, Red Cross, you name it.

Clean rags/scrap material: Either the SPCA in Te Rapa (they get used for cleaning cages), or a local car mechanic might need rags on an ongoing basis to get the grease off their hands.

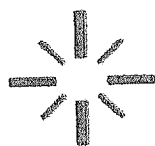
Food scraps: Know a pig farmer? (Or dig a compost hole next to the garden, line the sides and top with wood to keep the rats out)

Cardboard/paper: The recycling collection services in the Waikato/Waipā will pick up a box of paper/cardboard approximately the size of your recycling bin, as well as what's in your recycling bin. Just flatten any boxes.

General items/materials: Sometimes trademe is useful if the stuff is valuable, but if it's not (or you've been burned by trademe in the past), Freecycle is an online recycling network where you can list stuff you want to get rid of, as well as stuff you want - anything from wooden pallets to computer monitors. The Hamilton group is here:

The main reason for writing this was the amount of good quality materials I see going to waste or left to rot in the rain whenever the inorganic recycling season starts locally. By comparison, with a very small amount of effort you can possibly save someone else a heck of a lot of time and effort.

Magnesium Supplementation

Supplementing with Magnesium (Mg) for two to three weeks pre-calving will greatly reduce the risk of milk fever.

Before calving the addition of Magnesium Sulphate or Chloride in the water supply as well as providing Magnesium Oxide on the feed can be very effective in switching on the "Calcium releasing" mechanism. This enables the cow to release Calcium from her bones as well as making her more efficient at absorbing Calcium from the grass. It seems Magnesium Sulphate is better at doing this than Magnesium Chloride.

After calving, Magnesium Sulphate and Chloride are not so useful in providing enough Magnesium for the cows needs and often only Magnesium Oxide is really effective. Cows can't store Magnesium and so need a constant daily supply. Low blood Magnesium levels reduce her milk production and increase the chances of her going down with Grass Staggers (not to be confused with Ryegrass Staggers). Grass staggers is difficult to treat and is usually fatal.

Magnesium requirements

It is recommended dry cows receive a diet containing 0.35% Magnesium, and lactating cows 0.28% Magnesium.

NEWS FROM YOUR WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

This month Council meetings have included **workshops** discussing Representation arrangements, Library Reciprocal agreements, District Plan Review, Iwi Consultation, Gambling Policy, Dangerous and Insanitary buildings Policy and more. We also heard submissions to the Waste Management Minimisation Plan.

Every six years all Councils must review the arrangements for **representation** to ensure our communities are fairly represented on and by Council. We have been debating this arrangement for Waikato District over the last few months and we opted as our initial proposal that we adopt a modified status quo, retaining 13 councillors, plus Mayor, with slightly modified ward boundaries in the north where our population has grown, with some changes to the elected Community Committees. The changes will not affect districts in Eureka Ward. If you would like to see the recommended northern boundary changes a map can be viewed on the WDC website.

I have previously mentioned that we are required to review the **Waikato District Plan** every 10 years. The final part of the review was to consult with a group of people in the community about different aspects of the District Plan and how it might affect them, including landowners who have a historic building, notable tree or landscape or natural character area on their property.

Today, 27th June, we adopted the Proposed District Plan at a full Extraordinary Council meeting; the Proposed Plan will now be notified on 18 July, when the submission period opens, and submissions will close on 9 October. For more information you can email districtplan@waide.govt.nz. If your property will be affected by key changes in the Proposed Plan you will receive a letter that either details the proposed changes or prompts you to see if you would like to make a submission. We will be holding drop in sessions in August and September to help you make a submission. After 18 July you can see information on the Provisional Plan and supporting documents on www.waikatodistrict.govt.nz/districtplan

This week we also adopted the Long Term Plan. The LTP establishes the Council's infrastructure and financial strategies for the next 10 years and enables us to *adopt a new vision for liveable, thriving and connected communities*.

Waikato District has again been nominated for two awards in this year's **Local Government Excellence Awards** - for our plan to cater for growth in the north of the District and also the iconic Perry Bridge as part of the Te Awa River ride Ngaruawahia to Horotiu section that I mentioned in my newsletter last month. The awards attracted 75 applications and 22 finalists, and the winners will be announced at the Local Govt NZ conference in mid-July.

Don't forget to renew your dog registration by 20 July and dog owners can register their dog/s on line. A by-law now requires all dogs over three months to be microchipped, so, to apply for a dog licence, dogs need to be microchipped and the number included on your application form.

This month's launch of the **Little Libraries** was postponed and will now be held at Springhill Prison on 4th July. I will print some photographs in my next newsletter.

Woodlands are holding a StitchesTime exhibition in the homestead during July 10am – 3pm Monday to Friday – entry fee \$2. There will be special displays of christening gowns, wooden children's toys and needlework. Waikato District continues to attract **new business**. I noticed in the press recently that a NZ owned whisky distillery is to be built in Pokeno with production likely to begin in 2019. The family owned business chose Pokeno because of the high-quality water available in the area and will specialise in NZ single malt whisky to sell to markets around the world.

If you are a keen cyclist and would like to ride indoors during winter, **Avantidrome** are now opening earlier at weekends allowing cyclists to get a track or gym session in. Their opening hours are now Monday – Friday 6am – 9pm, Saturday 7:30am – 6:30pm and Sunday 7:30 – 6:30pm. If you want to use the Gallagher Bike Skills Park during the **school holidays** the concreted skills course is still open, and they are also holding school holiday programmes.
