

COMMUNITY COMMENT






CALF CLUB UPDATE







Tauwhare Playgroup







Eat Well - 'At Your Table'

The dining table. A central place where family and friends come together - for meals and celebrations or to catch up over a cup of tea or glass of wine.

What a great place to create healthy habits for life and role model good eating behaviours.

Research shows, eating together as a <u>family</u> can help to improve overall <u>dietary intake</u> and <u>food choices</u>, improve social skills and help to reduce <u>behavioural issues</u> in children/adolescence. These are such important areas to nurture but can be quickly lost in today's fast paced society if not prioritised.

So, if you don't already, why not sit down at *your* table to share some meals with family and friends. Have a chat, laugh, make memories and create some great healthy eating habits along the way.

Here are some simple things to try:

- 1. Eat slowly, relax and enjoy the company as well as the food.
- 2. Choose a colourful mix of (non starchy) **vegetables** that you love to eat (for example, salad greens, tomato, green beans, capsicum, mushroom). Fill half your plate with these vegetables. Then add smaller portions (¼ of your plate each) of **protein** (lean red meat, chicken, fish, tofu, egg etc) and **carbohydrate** (rice, pasta, starchy vegetables (potatoes, kumara, corn), bread, bread rolls, wraps etc).
- 3. Drinks water is best. Other good alternatives are sparkling water or soda water. Get creative and add fresh lemon, mint, cucumber and/or fresh ginger. If you are drinking alcohol, drink in moderation and add a few glasses of water between drinks. NZ Ministry of Health <u>guidelines</u> for alcohol are, no more than 3 standard drinks per day for men, no more than 2 standard drinks per day for women, with at least two alcohol free days a week. Examples of a standard drink are one 330ml bottle beer or 100ml glass of wine.
- 4. Be **mindful** and aware of your **hunger cues**. Stop eating when you feel satisfied/comfortably full (eating slowly will help with this).

Remember, healthy is a lifestyle. Make it simple, sustainable and enjoyable. Create healthy habits for life.

Start, 'At Your Table'.



TASTE BUDS

Tea Riffic Chicken

8 chicken pieces, either breast or legs

4 tbs honey

2 cups hot tea


4 potatoes

2 garlic cloves grated or chopped fine

1 onion sliced4 tbs soy sauceBlack pepper to taste

2 tbs butter

salt/pepper to taste



Method

Place chicken and onion in a large fry pan, brown. Combine all ingredients and pour over chicken, reduce heat, then boil gently till chicken is cooked and liquid has reduced. Thicken with corn flour if desired. Serve with lightly roasted potatoes in butter, grated garlic, salt and pepper to taste. Any veg goes well with this meal.

Lemon Curd Meringue


2 large free-range eggs separated55 g self-raising flour1 lemon grated rind and juice


55 g butter 285 ml milk 115 g sugar

Method

This is tasty and dead easy to make. It looks good cooked in a Pyrex dish, as it goes into layers as it cooks, with a sort of lemon curdy custard at the bottom and a spongy meringue top. Preheat the oven to 200°C/400°F/gas 6. Cream the butter, sugar and lemon rind in a mixing bowl. Add the egg yolks and flour and beat in, then add the milk and 3 tablespoons of lemon juice and mix well.

Whisk the egg whites in a separate bowl until stiff, then add the rest of the mixture. Mix it all well but don't over-mix it; you don't want the air to come out of the egg whites. Pour into a buttered ovenproof dish, stand the dish in a roasting tin about a third full of water, then bake in your preheated oven for about 45 minutes until the top is set and spongy and it's a nice golden colour.





IN YOUR GARDEN


Well as usual this time of year Christmas is just around the corner...where does the time go.

It's planting time, we have milder weather and grass is trying to grow... Spring is here!

All salad crops could be planted now as long as you don't live in a low lying frost area. If you are in a frost prone area you could plant tomatoes in a plastic or glass house, as we could get a light frost at the end of September. Avoid planting very frost tender plants maybe till Labour Weekend.

When planting veges or making a vege box, don't fill the area with compost at the bottom, fill with stones, old soil etc, then 30cm from the top put in compost, as veges only need to grow about 20cm into

the ground, compost below this level will not be reached by the plant roots.



Most of don't have much time for gardening etc. If you can put a couple of hours into forming a vege garden, plant, and in a few weeks when you're harvesting and enjoying your fresh spray-free veg you'll be happy you put the time in.

Bark is a good weed suppressant around large trees and shrubs but if used on a garden with flowering plants, small shrubs and the like, bark will leach the nitrogen from the soil.

Daffodils are looking great in most gardens at the moment, remember when flowering has finished don't cut back but leave the stems to die off and this encourage new bulbs to form.

All roses and fruit trees should be pruned as we discussed last month, if not do it as soon as possible.

The trials and tribulations of Windows 10

So, by now you've probably had some experience with or know someone who has had some experience with, Windows 10. They skipped 9, heading straight from Windows 8 to 10, which makes me think, how does Bill Gates tell time? Does he ever get up at 9am or is that just not an option? It's probably good that they skipped the 9, mind you, because that might've meant they would've had to put more time into developing their ideas, instead of giving me something that I have to fix.

Literally every second call I get nowadays is about a problem relating to Windows 10. It used to be viruses. It used to be people deliberately trying to cause harm, instead of a silly company managing to incapacitate vast swaths of computers by doing things without checking first. Arguably, Windows 7 was the same in it's infancy. But Win10, bless it's ephemeral heart, keeps putting out a new version of itself every six months, forcing customers to upgrade and experience the same growing pains over and over again, whilst supplying new features that only an infinitesimal fraction of the population use.

How sad. It's telling, perhaps, that in the years since the release of Windows 8 the desktop market share of Windows has shrunk by 10%, while Apple's share has gone up 10%. Do I recommend Apple? Not particularly. They're great when they're working, but once they break they're designed to be chucked away, as they're generally very difficult to take apart. And having recently spent 2 hours on their customer support line, being passed between 7 people, to get a refund for a customer due to an ordering bungle on their part, let me tell you, their staff are not exactly 'geniuses'.

Something else you can't rely on is Windows 7 being around forever, security patches for that operating system cease in January 2020*. And believe me, with the huge amount of vulnerabilities that are being uncovered in computer chips at the moment (google "Foreshadow intel" for a more recent one), you can't really afford to be online and unpatched. Which is another reason to upgrade from Windows Vista and XP, if you're still using either of those*. Installing Linux instead is an option, but only if you're doing basic web browsing and email checking, and know a friendly IT person who can sort out your issues for you.

So what do I recommend if you already have Windows 10? Grin and bear it. If you have problems, write feedback to Microsoft through the Feedback Hub app in Windows 10, or call them out on twitter publicly. If you have the 'pro' edition of Win10 you can also delay the OS 'upgrades' by up to a year through the settings, avoiding many teething problems. Hopefully at some point a bright spark within that company will wake up and say: "I know what's wrong we should've been making a solid product, rather than a broken yearly service!". Then perhaps we'll get an operating system which doesn't make me money. I mean, I guess I hope that happens?

- * Windows Vista and XP have not been supported by Microsoft for many years now and are not patched against any of the newer security vulnerabilities. Do not use them on the internet, though offline is fine. BTW, though the 'free upgrade' period for Windows 7 to Windows 10 has technically passed, any computer with a valid Windows 7 license can still be upgraded to Windows 10 for free by doing what is known as a 'clean install' using the Windows 7 key; a beyond-novice-level procedure, but certainly doable with the right IT person. Hint hint.

KEEPING SCAMMERS AT BAY

Technological advances have opened up endless possibilities and not all of these are good. With increased ability to connect with others, some of those with whom you are connecting might be scammers.

No one is invulnerable to being a target for fraud, or 'profit motivated crime'. The word 'scam' can trivialise the crime.

Figure out if you are being scammed:

Has someone contacted you unexpectedly?

Have they promised you something?

Have they asked you to do something?

Someone may be asking you to:

- Pay in advance for something e.g. a holiday, large pay-out or exciting advantage. This is advance fee fraud.
- Give them remote access to your computer. This is a technical support scam.
- Enter details into a website Iyou've been directed to. This is phishing. Banks, other financial institutions or Govt. Agencies never contact you by email to confirm personal or financial information.
- Pay upfront for an unexpected offer e.g. a product, experience or membership. Similar to an advance fee fraud.
- Invest money after approaching you about a scheme, property, managed fund or business venture. Finance and investment frauds come in many forms.
- Buy crypto-currency e.g. Bitcoin, Ethereum. Buying crypto-currencies or using crypto-exchange can put you at higher risk of being the target a scam or fraud.
- Pay an invoice sent via email or letter. Could be an invoice scam
- Provide details for a survey. Could be gathering information and building your trust for a future scam.
- Enter your credit card details, account number or PIN. Phishing scams attempts at identity theft, and fake websites are all scams that could ask for credit card or banking details.
- Pay to recover money lost in a scam. Called a recovery scam.
- Start a friendship or relationship. Affinity or romance scams rely on your good nature to build a relationship before asking for money or involving you in crime without your knowledge.
- Pay them after responding to your advert. One of many types of advance payment and advance fee scams.

- Take a job where you receive money, keep a portion and then send the rest. A money mule scam.

So take care!

It is important to be suspicious because scammers have ways of making their offers seem real and can come from within New Zealand or internationally.

Some Security tips.

- Review your credit card limits, and lower these if you can. Keep a credit card with the lowest possible limit just for online transactions.
- Check your bank statements carefully. If you notice even a tiny amount you can't identify, contact your bank immediately. A fraudster could be testing you!
- When travelling, don't leave your boarding pass in the plane. Dispose of it securely. There is a great deal of personal information on a boarding pass.
- Burn or shred all documents such as old bank statements. Don't put them in the normal rubbish. They contain personal details which could attract fraudsters.
- Be careful what information you share in surveys. Again, you could be asked what might seem innocuous questions, but any personal information could end up in the wrong hands. Don't be afraid of saying 'no'.
- Don't be afraid of putting the phone down on unsolicited callers, especially if they are asking for personal information.
- Never give out your credit card number to unsolicited callers.

If you think you might have been a victim of a scam, it is recommended that you take the following steps:

Stop all contact with the scammer

Stop all payments


Contact the bank or service you make payments through and inform them of what has happened.
