

The kids love the schools and are making friends. The wife loves being so close to the shops for easy spending.



TASTE BUDS

ASIAN SLAW

3oz grated broccoli stems
2oz finely chopped celery
1oz Red Bell Pepper finely chopped
2oz seasoned Rice Vinegar
1 tbs vegetable oil

3oz grated carrot
1.5oz chopped mushrooms
1 tbs chopped dry roasted peanuts
2-3 drops hot pepper sauce
1 tbs chopped Coriander

In a bowl mix dry ingredients.

In a small jug mix the wet ingredients and pour over the slaw, mixing well

2 cloves of Garlic fine chopped 1oz chopped parsley 1 x 800g can chopped tomatoes 8oz spaghetti 500g prawns (more if required) 3 spring
onions chopped
1oz chopped basil
1oz Parmesan cheese
6oz white wine

Cook onion and garlic. Add tomatoes, wine, parsley and basil.

Cook gently for 25 minutes

Cook spaghetti. Add prawns and parmesan cheese to tomato and cook for a further 5 minutes on high.



Mix all together and serve.

If you want ripe tomatoes at Christmas plant them into a good size pot. Keep outside; if the temperature is 3 or below move the pot plants into the garage or a safe place from the frost. When mid-November comes plant these mature tomato plants into your vege garden and you will have tomatoes by

Christmas.

Pet peeves of a computer technician

This is going to be essentially a gripes article. Hey, everyone gets one right? In every single profession there's stuff that most non-experts get wrong. I wouldn't have the faintest clue about all the things I'm getting wrong about my car, or even about the cereal I eat in the mornings. So, don't take it personally, but listen up, you might learn something useful:

1. Your computer is not a hard drive.

Okay, here's what a hard drive looks like: It's a small thing that sits inside the computer and stores all your documents and every program the computer runs. That box sitting on the floor with the power button? Not a hard drive. It's a desktop computer. I wouldn't say I'm bothered by this, it just makes communication tricky.

2. "High performance" power mode in Windows does not do what you think it does

I see a lot of computers configured by amateur enthusiasts who see this setting and think "Oo I'll get some more performance". Unfortunately it does not work that way. All this feature does it turn off the ability for the computer to save power when it's not doing anything. It doesn't speed anything up, nor is it useful outside of a few very specialised scenarios that the average computer user and gamer will never come across. The default power mode is best for the majority of computers.

3. Google is not a web browser

This one's understandable. When people click on their web browser, the first thing they usually see is the google search page (or possibly the bing search page if they're using a microsoft browser). Also, for reasons unknown to us mere mortals, most web browsers have taken away the name of the browser at the top of the screen when you run it — unlike most other computer programs. And in the past ten years Microsoft removed, again for unknown reasons, the name of the program from the bottom of the screen. Very stupid. So people generally don't know what web browser they're using when I ask them, they just "go to google". Fair enough. Here's how to know what web browser you're using: if you click on a blue "E", it's either Internet Explorer or Edge. If you click on a red-green-yellow circle logo, you're running Chrome. If you click on an orange and blue circle logo, you're running Firefox.

4. You absolutely totally actually do have a password for your email, honest!

This one is also understandable. When you enter passwords for websites into your web browser, it tends to remember them for you, so it will already be entered the next time you visit that website. But also, websites can store a little bit of information on your computer called a 'cookie' that, amongst other things, stores your login details. So sometimes you don't even have to log in to check your email, it just takes you straight there. But eventually you're going to need that password again.

This one always catches people out when they move to a new computer or the old one has problems, or their email gets hacked. You have a password, but you probably didn't write it down. So I recommend to people that they have a notebook separate to their computer that they write down all their websites, usernames and passwords in, immediately after creating them. This means, when the inevitable occurs – and it will occur – they can get back up and running in no time, rather than going through a 15 minute process, or losing access to their email entirely.

Alright, that's enough, I swear I'll have something more positive to chat about next article. Be smart, be safe.

What Killed the Calf?



The calves are doing well and suddenly you find one dead in the paddock. What could it have died of? At this time of the year there is quite a list.

Blackleg: Causing destruction of an area of muscle somewhere on the calf's body

with the resulting toxins causing death.

Treatment: None, always fatal.

Prevention: Vaccinate with clostridial vaccine.

Clostridium perfringens: Causing a massive intestinal upheaval.

Treatment: Always fatal.

Prevention: Vaccinate with clostridial vaccine

Gut problem: Can be many causes, such as a "twisted" gut.

Treatment: Maybe surgery in rare cases.

Prevention: None — just one of those things.

Salmonella: Not seen often but will cause major problems with diarrhea.

Treatment: Antibiotics if recognized soon enough.
Prevention: Vaccinate with salmonella vaccine

<u>Yersiniosis:</u> A gut invader similar to salmonella. Treatment: Antibiotics if recognized soon enough.

Prevention: No vaccine available. Ensure animals do not get stressed.

Bloat: Eating too much grass and/or clover too fast.

Treatment: Bloat drenches, paraffin oil or if too bad, stab on the left-hand side. Prevention: Bloat oils in water trough or make sure they always have plenty to eat.

<u>Thiamine Deficiency:</u> Causing rapid destruction of the brain — rapid death within 24 hours.

Treatment: Intravenous thiamine injections and corticosteriods. A dramatic recovery is possible if minimal brain destruction has occurred.

Prevention: Exact cause unknown so difficult to recommend prevention.

<u>Bovine Viral Diarrhoea (BVD)</u>: If the calf was a carrier of the BVD virus and then is infected for a second time with a different strain of this virus then death may occur within a few days or it could linger for a month before dying.

Treatment: None.

Prevention: Vaccines are available but not always useful. The virus is widespread in New Zealand and you would need to talk to a vet to decide if vaccination is appropriate in your circumstances.

<u>Listeriosis</u>: Sometimes associated with feeding molding feeds such as silage — the animal initially starts showing nervous signs like circling.

Treatment: Antibiotics can be successful if given early enough.

Prevention: Can reduce the risk by not feeding moldy hay.

Pneumonia: Often found dead or hunched over breathing rapidly.

Treatment: Antibiotics if get there soon enough.

Prevention: Make sure you have healthy well grown calves

As you can see from the above list, which is quite extensive but by no means complete, there is quite a list of diseases. If you find a dead calf which is still fresh it may be worthwhile getting a post mortem done as some of the diseases are preventable.

NEWS FROM YOUR WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

In my last newsletter I mentioned the end of free access to Hamilton City libraries for Waikato District residents — thank you for all the feedback I received. We put another proposal to the City Council this month but unfortunately the city rejected the proposal but acknowledged our cross-boundary connections and said it would initiate wider cross-boundary discussions with WDC. Our CEO Gavin Ion in a recent press release commented that People don't think about territorial boundaries when they go about their lives, whether visiting Hamilton Gardens (Hamilton City) travelling to Raglan or the Hakarimatas (Waikato District) or popping out to Lake Karapiro to swim or water ski (Waipa District) These are all highly valued and visited regionally-used assets and to be fair libraries are similar.

We will continue to work with the city with cross-border collaboration but in the meantime our Council is working on a proposal for library access for our residents. The Councillors for the four Wards around the city, Eureka, Tamahere, Newcastle and Hukanui, will have input into the WDC proposal. I voted to retain the current arrangement when it was originally debated as I felt we were getting good value for money and the feedback Councillors received after the decision was announced endorsed my stance.

Eureka has, with 30 other rural communities, joined the Little Library scheme. The hall committee has placed the Eureka Little Library in an excellent spot at the front of the hall. I note in this month's issue of WDC Link newsletter that if you take a selfie with one of our little libraries, tag a friend and share it on our new Waikato Placemaking Facebook group Creative Spaces Waikato, you'll go into a draw for one of our two \$50 book vouchers (You have to live in the Waikato District to win).

Matangi District has received funding from Council's Heritage Fund to create a Roll of Honour for those from the Matangi District who died on service or were returned servicemen in WW1. (I note names of men from families now in other districts in Eureka Ward are listed). On Remembrance Day 11th November at 11am the Honours Board will be dedicated. The names on the Honours Board can be found in the Matangi Link https://matangilink.nz/2018/10/11/matangi-100-years-ago-was-your-family-here. The Committee would like to know of any relatives of those on the Roll of Honour and who will attend the dedication. Phone Ian Wallace 829 5848 to let him know.

The Huntly Section of the Expressway is on track for a 2020 completion. This 15.2km section, which takes SH1 across lowlands and over the Taupiri Range, is being built out of public view. If you are interested in this section of the expressway, NZTA are hosting their first public information day on site on Saturday 27 Oct. Starting at the site office off McVie Rd, Huntly East between 10am and 2pm.

To ensure the Southern Districts Water supply has good water reserves to cater for unforeseen shut downs from the Hamilton City supply we have asked staff to progress the new water reservoir. NZTA have agreed that we can site it on surplus expressway land around Matangi.

The plans for the Hamilton to Auckland start up passenger rail service continue. Our Council is supporting train stations in Tuakau and Huntly and have committed to cost share funding with NZTA. I understand that the carriages for the train service are being revamped — I'll keep you up to date with progress.

Thanks to those who made a submission to the Proposed Waikato District Plan, which closed on 9 October. Council is now summarising the submissions which will be published. After a period for further submissions the hearing process will begin.

I frequently receive phone calls about rubbish dumping. This is a huge problem in the district and I note that last year 746 requests were received to collect rubbish. We have now set up a *Let's Stop the Dodgy Dumpers* Facebook Group -https://www.facebook.com/groups/dodgydumpers. You can also report dumping online or phone 0800 492 452. For safety reasons do not touch any dumped material.

WHILE other kids had lollies for breakfast


I had to eat cereal, eggs and toast.

None of us kids were ever arrested for shoplifting,


Or busted for dope.
