

Morrinsville Road – Fit for Purpose Upgrades – Construction Update

Works completed:

Established on site. Implemented perimeter fencing, located services with potholing, and installed CCTV
Concentrated excavations in areas where subsoil drainage is to be installed
Installed temporary path for pedestrians and cyclist to get around the site safely
Cut and formed future shared path from new pedestrian crossing to Silverdale Road
Formed and laid concrete for the wider shared path between Matangi Road and Morrinsville Road
Excavated areas ready for the raingardens
20% of the subsoil drain network installed
Installed all catchpits and signal ducts
All concrete and kerbing has been removed and at least 50% of the pavement has been removed



Works planned for the next 2 weeks:

The widened shared path opens between Matangi Road and Morrinsville Road by Friday 13 March
Finalise subsoil drains
Install rain gardens & outlets
Prep area for subbase pavement
Connect subsoils to stormwater outlets
Excavate more of the main road alignment
Drilling for power and fibre

Businesses are open

Businesses, including cafes and a flower shop are all still open on Morrinsville Road and Matangi Road.

Benefits of road closure

Closing the intersection means we can:

Complete the work 5 to 6 months faster than if we had kept it open with a stop/go system, which would have still caused significant travel delays over a longer period. Save around \$1million in construction costs, which are being reinvested into wide shared paths on the most popular school routes further along Morrinsville Road, which the community asked for. Avoid staged construction creating a higher quality road surface without joins.







Belgian Blonde = #3 for Belgian Blondes.


(The same app still has Bootleg Brewery as 8th out of 190 in NZ.)

The roadworks on Morrinsville Road don't seem to be getting in the way of you guys finding Bootleg. But keep supporting local -especially when local is as good as this!



Gardening Tips

Gardening tool maintenance involves cleaning, sharpening, and protecting tools to prevent rust and ensure longevity. Key steps include removing soil with water, using wire brushes for stubborn debris, sharpening blades with files or stones, and applying oil (e.g., linseed) to metal parts and wooden handles.

Maintenance Tasks

Remove dirt, sap, and debris after every use with a damp cloth or warm soapy water.

Scrub away rust spots using steel wool, a wire brush, or fine sandpaper.

Keep blades on shears, secateurs, and shovels sharp using a sharpening stone or metal file to ensure clean cuts

Spray moving parts, joints, and hinges with oil to prevent rust and ensure smooth operation.

Sand down rough wooden handles to prevent splinters and apply linseed oil to keep them from drying out.

Prevent spreading plant diseases by cleaning blades with a solution of one part bleach to 10 parts water.

Store tools in a dry place, such as a shed or garage.

Routine & Long-Term Care

Check for cracks, loose bolts, and damage regularly.

Perform a deep clean and oil application before storing tools for the winter.

Power Tools: Regularly check air filters, sharpen, or change chains for equipment like chainsaws and mowers.



Recipes

Roast Tomato Sauce

Great for pizzas and pasta, roasting bring out more flavour. The recipe below is just a guide. Add more garlic if you love it. Use brown onions if you don't have red. If space permits and you have the tomatoes double or triple the recipe.

2kg Tomatoes	1-2 red onions peeled and quartered
1 red capsicum, chopped into 4-6 large pieces	
2-3 cloves garlic, peeled	slosh of extra virgin olive oil
Salt	fresh basil or oregano

Depending on the size of the tomatoes, ie if they big cut in half or quarters if cherry leave whole.

Place the tomatoes on a oven tray on top of the onions, capsicum and garlic.

Drizzle over some olive oil and sprinkle with salt

Roast in the oven at 175 for 1-2 hours. You want the onion and capsicum to be soft.

The longer you roast them the more intense the sauce will be, as more of the liquid will have evaporated. Allow to cool, then place in a blender with herbs and puree until smooth. Freeze the sauce in ziplock bags.

Nana's Impossible Pie

½ cup flour	2 tsp vanilla essence
125g soft butter	1 cup coconut
2 cups milk	4 eggs
1 cup castor sugar	2 tsp mixed spice (heaped)

Put all the ingredients into a bowl. Beat with an electric beater until well mixed. Pour into a greased flan dish. Bake 1 hour at 175. The mixture separates during cooking to produce a base, custard centre and coconut topping.





Tamahere-Woodlands Councillors' update March 2026

It's a dogs' pool party!

The 8th annual Waikato Pound Pups pool party is set to go on Saturday 11 April at the Ngaruawahia swimming pool for dogs to enjoy a swim before the pool closes for winter. The pool will be open to all friendly dogs from 10am-1pm and from 1-2pm for small dogs (under 20kgs) and nervous pups who need a little extra space. Entry is \$15 per dog (cash or EFTPOS on the day) and all money raised will be split between the Waikato District Council's dog desexing programme (the PUP fund) and the Fundraising for Impounded Dogs Charitable Trust. There will be goodie bags, spot prizes and raffles – all donated by generous partners and supporters.

Establishing IAWAI – progress to date

Waikato District Council has signed an agreement to transfer just under \$1 billion of waters assets to the new council controlled waters company IAWAI – passing a major milestone towards establishing the CCO with Hamilton City Council on 1 July. The assets are made up of property, plant and equipment worth \$832.3m (including work in progress of \$185.8m). The value of Waikato District's assets are about 30% of the \$3 billion assets being transferred to IAWAI by Waikato District and Hamilton City, but both councils will have a 50/50 voting share as joint shareholders. Both Councils also retain ownership of their stormwater networks but are expected to delegate much of their stormwater operations to IAWAI.

Feedback sought on IAWAI water services strategy

IAWAI's water services strategy is a 10-year-plan setting out how the new waters company will manage existing assets, meet new rules and regulations, and expand water and wastewater services to cater for new growth in Waikato District and Hamilton City. The strategy includes a reduction to water charges increases previously forecast by both Councils (down \$91 for Hamilton households and reductions on forecasts of up to \$247 for Waikato District households – depending on the services you currently get.) The strategy also includes a \$3 billion capital programme over 10 years to renew, upgrade and expand the network our communities depend on. Waikato District Council retains AA+ credit rating

The Council has retained its AA+ (outlook negative) credit rating from Fitch Ratings following an annual review. It's the highest rating achievable by NZ councils. The negative outlook reflects sector-wide uncertainty including local government reform. A high credit rating gives access to lower interest rates, easing pressure on rates.


Road works

- Waikato District Council's new roading contractors, Higgins in the north and Fulton Hogan in the south, have so far delivered 66.5km resealing of the 96.35km planned for this summer.
- Hamilton City Council reports good progress is being made on construction of the Morrinsville/Matangi Rd roundabout (planned for a late May re-opening).
